#NHLSTATS AS AUSTON MATTHEWS APPROACHES 60-GOAL MARK

- * **Auston Matthews** (53-26—79 in 60 GP) can record the second 60-goal season of his NHL career after scoring exactly 60 in 73 games en route to winning the Maurice "Rocket" Richard Trophy in 2021-22.
- * The 2023-24 NHL season would mark the third straight campaign to feature at least one 60-goal scorer, following 2022-23 (**Connor McDavid** & **David Pastrnak**) and 2021-22 (Matthews). The only other instances in League history where three or more consecutive seasons featured at least one 60-goal scorer were a streak of 14 straight from 1980-81 to 1993-94 and six in a row from 1973-74 to 1978-79.
- * Matthews (San Ramon, Calif.) is the NHL's only U.S.-born player with *one* 60-goal season and can become the <u>ninth skater in League history with two or more</u>, joining **Mike Bossy** (5), **Wayne Gretzky** (5), **Phil Esposito** (4), **Mario Lemieux** (4), **Brett Hull** (3), **Pavel Bure** (2), **Jari Kurri** (2) and **Steve Yzerman** (2).
- * Matthews is the <u>only player in franchise history with one 60-goal campaign</u>. He can become the third player in NHL history with multiple 60-goal seasons for an Original Six club, following **Phil Esposito** (4 w/ BOS) and **Steve Yzerman** (2 w/ DET).
- * Matthews can become the seventh different player in League history to reach 60 goals in a season in 65 games or fewer and first since **Mario Lemieux** did so 28 years ago with the Penguins.

- * Matthews can become the seventh different NHL player with *zero empty-netters* at the time of his 60th goal, following **Brett Hull** (3x; last: 1991-92), **Mike Bossy** (2x; last: 1982-83), **Phil Esposito** (2x; last: 1973-74), **Guy Lafleur** (1977-78), **Steve Shutt** (1976-77) and **Reggie Leach** (1975-76).
- * Matthews has scored a <u>League-leading 38 even-strength goals this season</u>, which mark the <u>third highest single-season total in franchise history</u> (since 1933-34 when goals by type were officially tracked) behind his 44 in 2021-22 and 41 by **Frank Mahovlich** in 1960-61.
- * Matthews has recorded <u>15 multi-goal games this season</u>, including <u>six hat tricks</u> with four of them scored in consecutive fashion (<u>Oct. 11-14, 2023</u> & <u>Feb. 15-17, 2024</u>). Matthews' six hat tricks are the <u>most in a campaign</u> by a Toronto player and he needs one multi-goal game to set a single-season franchise record.
- * Matthews is on pace to become the <u>ninth different 70-goal scorer in League history</u> and first since 1992-93 when **Teemu Selanne** (76-56—132 in 84 GP) and future Maple Leafs forward **Alexander Mogilny** (76-51—127 in 77 GP) had 76 with the *original* Winnipeg Jets and Sabres, respectively. Matthews' 61st goal will establish a <u>single-season franchise record</u>, besting the current mark that he set in 2021-22.
