# **NORTH AMERICAN SKATERS**



MATTHEW SCHAEFER
Defense | Erie (OHL)
Born: Hamilton, Ont.
No. 1-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Schaefer's 1.29 points per game in 2024-25 was the third-highest mark by any OHL defenseman (min. 2 GP) trailing only Saginaw Spirit blueliner **Zayne Parekh** (1.75 P/GP) and London Knights defenseman **Sam Dickinson** (1.65 P/GP).
- \* Was named to Team Canada's roster for the 2025 World Junior Championship and tallied 1-1—2 in 2 GP before an injury forced him out of the tournament.
- \* Named to OHL First All-Rookie Team in 2023-24 after posting 3-14—17 in 56 GP.
- \* Followed Erie Otters franchise cornerstones **Connor McDavid** (2012) and **Ryan O'Reilly** (2007) as the third OHL first overall selection in the organization's history.
- \* Captained his team to gold at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup and 2023 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.
- \* His brother, **Jonathan**, also a defenseman, played for the OHL's Niagara IceDogs (2015-16 to 2018-19) and at Brock University (2019-20 to 2022-23).

#### NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

A second-year OHL defenseman who was selected first overall in the 2023 OHL priority selection. After successfully leading Canada's Under-18 team to gold as captain at the Hlinka-Gretzky, he missed the start of the OHL season and has returned with strong play as a top defense prospect who's on everyone's radar. He does it all on the ice – defends well as an elite skater with good gap control and has the ability and smarts to consistently produce offensively. He has a great feel for the game and knows when to make a simple play, when to block a shot and how to get the job done. His puck retrievals are on point, he can skate his way out of trouble and capably lead the rush offensively. He quarterbacks the power play and is an offensive threat to score or set up teammates. A special talent and top prospect for the Draft.

MICHAEL MISA
Center | Saginaw (OHL)
Born: Oakville, Ont.
No. 2-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Misa led the CHL in scoring after posting 62-72—134 (65 GP). His season was highlighted by a 28-game point streak the third-longest across the CHL 46 multi-point outings (70% of all games he played this season), 16 multi-goal performances, three hat tricks and eight games with four-plus points.
- \* Became the first Saginaw Spirit player to lead the CHL in scoring his point total is tied with **John Tavares** (2006-07 w/ Oshawa Generals) for the most by an OHL U-18 skater since 2000.
- \* In January 2025, Misa was named the 26th captain in Spirit history.
- \* Was granted "exceptional player" status by Hockey Canada, making him eligible for the 2022 OHL Priority selection at an earlier age, and was selected first overall by Saginaw. In his rookie season of 2022-23, Misa was named OHL Rookie of the Year after leading all first-year skaters with 22-34—56 in 45 GP.
- \* Helped Saginaw win the Memorial Cup in his second OHL season (2023-24), where he produced at a point-per-game rate in the tournament (0-5—5 in 5 GP).
- \* Helped Canada earn a gold medal at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup where he tied for the team lead in assists and produced 2-6—8 in 5 GP. He also won silver at the 2022 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (3-3—6 in 7 GP).
- \* His brother, **Luke**, was a fifth-round pick by the Flames in the 2024 NHL Draft (150th overall) and skated for the OHL's Brampton Steelheads in 2024-25.

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

The eighth player granted exceptional status by Hockey Canada and the sixth to play in the OHL as a 15-year-old. Drafted No. 1 overall in the 2022 OHL Priority Selection by the Saginaw Spirit. Playing in his third OHL season after winning the 2024 Memorial Cup. Named assistant captain to start the season, he has taken his game to another level and is putting up big offensive numbers. He's bigger, stronger and faster than previous seasons. His first three steps are lightning quick and when you add the elite skill set and elite hockey IQ, he's a very dangerous offensive threat. A clever playmaker who makes plays at speed and knows how to put the puck in the net. Plays with a consistent, impressive compete level and knows how to use his body to win puck battles. When he's on the ice his quickness, creativity and hockey sense are off the charts.

JAMES HAGENS
Center | Boston College (NCAA)
Born: Hauppauge, N.Y.
No. 3-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Concluded the season fourth in points among freshmen across the nation (11-26—37 in 37 GP) and third on Boston College in scoring behind his teammates who have already been drafted: **Ryan Leonard** (49 pts; No. 8 in 2023 by WSH) and **Gabriel Perreault** (48 points; No. 23 in 2023 by NYR).
- \* Won gold at the 2025 World Junior Championship and finished tied for the fourth-most goals in the tournament (5) and fourth on Team USA in points (9) behind three players already drafted into the NHL.
- \* Led USA Hockey's National Development Program's Under-18 Team in 2023-24 after posting 39-63—102 (58 GP) 13 points more than the next-closest player (**Cole Eiserman**: No. 20 in 2024 by NYI).
- \* Finished his NTDP career ranking fifth in program history for career points (187) and career assists (115).
- \* Won gold at the 2023 Under-18 World Championship (1-4—5 in 7 GP) and the 2022 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge, where he averaged three points per game to finish with the most assists (13) and points (21) in the tournament.
- \* Earned a silver medal at the 2024 Under-18 World Championship Hagens was named tournament MVP and best forward after finishing with the most assists and points (9-13—22 in 7 GP).
- \* He currently plays with his brother, **Michael**, at Boston College. Their father, **Michael Sr.**, played three seasons of college hockey at SUNY-Brockport (NCAA Division III).

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

An NCAA freshman playing center for a very talented Boston College team. A very good skater with a dynamic heads-up game who plays with confidence, patience and savvy with the puck. Ultra quick ability to read and react. Always a scoring threat off the rush and can set up his teammates from anywhere on the ice. Elusive with the puck and can deceive defenders by looking them off and making a pass or taking a shot that is unexpected. Excellent hands and makes creative plays that others just can't see. A special player with elite hockey sense and compete level. The type of player that elevates his game when it counts the most. He wants the puck on his stick and has "Game Changer" ability. The complete offensive package with a very high hockey intelligence in all three zones.

JAKE O'BRIEN
Center | Brantford (OHL)
Born: Whitby, Ont.
No. 4-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Finished the season tied for seventh in assists and points across the OHL after amassing 32-66—98 (66 GP), while his 41 power-play assists led the league. His season included two hat tricks, a five-point outing and 14 games with three-plus points, which helped Brantford finish first in their conference.
- \* Won MVP honors for Team East in their overtime win at the OHL's Inaugural Connor McDavid Top Prospects Game after posting 0-3—3, including setting up the game winner.
- \* Led the OHL in points and assists among rookies in 2023-24 after posting 13-51—64 (61 GP), which included 19 multi-point games. His 51 assists were 15 more than the next-closest rookie.
- \* Won the Emms Family Award as the OHL's rookie of the year in 2023-24 and was named to the CHL All-Rookie Team.
- \* Won gold at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup and represented Team Canada Red at the 2023 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.
- \* His mother, **Amy Turek**, was a women's hockey star in the 90s playing Canadian University Hockey at Wilfred Laurier University, for the Beatrice Aeros of the NWHL and for Team Canada at various events.

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

Possesses a lot of offensive tools in his toolbox – his hockey sense being the biggest one. Natural ability and instincts to see the ice and read the play very well. The type of player every teammate wants to play with as you know he'll find you with the puck for a scoring chance. Great hands, puck skills and creativity as well as the finishing touch to put the puck in the net. Responsible. Uses his smarts defensively and is always in the right spot with good details. A very high ceiling as he still has lots of room to grow and get stronger.

RADIM MRTKA
Defense | Seattle (WHL)
Born: Havlickuv, Czechia
No. 5-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Recorded 3-32—35 (42 GP) in his first season playing in North America to finish third in points per game (0.81) among rookie defensemen. He also finished tied for fifth on his team in scoring and tops among both defense and rookie categories.
- \* Split the 2023-24 season between HC Ocelari Trinec's Under-17 team and their junior team. With the U-17 club, Mrtka posted 3-10—13 (18 GP) for the 12th-highest points-per-game rate among defenseman, while his 4-7—11 (19 GP) on their junior team marked the third-most points by a 16-year-old defenseman across the league.
- \* Made his professional debut in 2023-24 skating in three games at the highest level of hockey in Czechia.
- \* Won silver with Czechia at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup. He also represented his country at the 2025 Under-18 World Championship, 2024 Under-18 World Championship and 2023 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

A huge 6'6" right-handed two-way defenseman. He looks like the prototype of an NHL player. A mobile, strong skater with good acceleration and speed for a player of his size. Plays with confidence, handles the puck well, and likes to use his big frame in battles. Good reach and a fine understanding of the game. Plays a solid two-way game and likes to join the rush. Makes smart passes. Tough to play against close to the net. Fine work ethic. Very good with the puck under checking pressure. Generates many shots from the back end, especially when playing on the power play. Good at jumping down from the point to finish off a scoring chance. Boxes out and protects his net-front well. Wins board battles with consistency. Sticks up for and comes to the aid of teammates. Effective on the penalty kill with a good and active stick to strip and disrupt.

PORTER MARTONE
Right Wing | Brampton (OHL)
Born: Peterborough, Ont.
No. 6-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Captain of the OHL's Brampton Steelheads in 2024-25, Martone concluded the season seventh in points (tied), fourth in game-winning goals (tied) and 11th in goals (tied) across the league (37-61—98 in 57 GP).
- \* Recorded 4-5—9 in their first round series against the Oshawa Generals in the 2025 postseason, where he averaged 1.50 points per game despite falling to Oshawa in six contests.
- \* Split his 2022-23 OHL rookie season with Sarnia and Mississauga, where he ranked 11th in rookie scoring with 19-16—35 in 61 GP. He doubled that output in his second OHL season, leading his team in goals while producing 33-38—71 in 60 GP.
- \* One of three draft-eligible players on Team Canada's roster at the 2025 World Junior Championship (1-0—1 in 3 GP). He also represented his country alongside **Sidney Crosby** and **Nathan MacKinnon** at the 2025 World Championship.
- \* Won gold with Team Canada at the 2023 Hlinka Gretzky Cup (2-3—5 in 5 GP) and at the 2024 Under-18 World Championship, where he captained his country and finished second in the tournament for assists (12) and third in points (17). He also has a silver from the 2022 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (7-5—12 in 7 GP) and bronze from the 2023 Under-18 World Championship.
- \* His father, **Mike**, was a fourth-round pick by the Sabres in the 1996 NHL Draft (106th overall) who captained the OHL's Peterborough Petes in junior and played pro in the AHL and ECHL winning the ECHL's Kelly Cup in 1998-99 with the Mississippi Sea Wolves.

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

A third-year OHL player originally selected fifth overall by the Sarnia Sting in the 2023 OHL Priority selection. Named captain of the Brampton Steelheads to start the 2024-25 season. Putting up outstanding offensive numbers and can play any type of game which will translate well at the next level. Elite hockey sense which allows him to slow the game down to the pace he chooses. He also has the elite puck skills and hands to take advantage of the time and space he creates. Can play physical and will back it up. Has a nose for the net that you can't teach, utilizing his puck control, reach and skills to lead his team's offense. Can score goals in all different ways. Plays the right way in all situations and is his team's leader for a reason.

CALEB DESNOYERS
Center | Moncton (QMJHL)
Born: Saint-Hyacinthe, Que.
No. 7-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Amassed 35-49—84 in 56 GP to finish the season tied for fifth in scoring across the league and ninth in assists. He also recorded a 15-game point streak (12-15—27), which was the third longest by a QMJHL player this season.
- \* Posted 9-21—30 (19 GP) to help the Wildcats win the 2024 QMJHL championship. He finished second in scoring and first in assists across the league in the postseason to earn QMJHL Playoffs MVP (Guy Lafleur Trophy) and went on to tally 1-1—2 (4 GP) during the Memorial Cup.
- \* Won the 2024-25 QMJHL Personality of the Year (Paul Dumont Trophy).
- \* Finished third in rookie scoring across the QMJHL in 2023-24 after posting 20-36—56 (60 GP), second in assists and seventh in goals.
- \* Is a three-time gold medalist, winning the 2023 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (3-2—5 in 8 GP), where he wore an 'A,' the 2024 Under-18 World Championship (1-4—5 in 5 GP) and the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup (1-4—5 in 5 GP).
- \* His brother, **Elliot**, was selected by the Flyers 135th overall in the 2020 NHL Draft. He spent four years playing in the QMJHL and concluded his time in the league by captaining the Halifax Mooseheads. Elliot appeared in four games with Philadelphia in 2022-23 and has spent the past three seasons playing in the AHL.

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

Second season in the QMJHL. Played an important role with Canada at the Hlinka-Gretzky Cup. A versatile, two-way player who can contribute to a team in a variety of ways. His hockey IQ is very good and he has a good sense of anticipation. Good offensive skills with his vision and feel for the game. Very good playmaker who also displays a scoring touch around the net. He's willing to do most of the dirty work to retrieve 50-50 pucks and will play a physical style when needed. His skating is good and will continue to get more powerful as he matures physically. Plays the center position well, supports his defensemen down low in his zone and will break up plays. Prospect who has lots of transferable pro elements in his game.

# ROGER McQUEEN Center | Brandon (WHL) Born: Saskatoon, Sask. No. 8-Ranked North American Skater

- \* McQueen missed 51 games this season yet produced at least a point in 71% of the contests he did play and finished the campaign with the highest point-per-game rate on his team (1.18).
- \* Finished second on the Wheat Kings with a 0.96 point-per-game rate in 2023-24 (21-30—51 in 53 GP) and topped the team in power-play points with 7-8—15. He also led his club in goals and points (tied) during the WHL playoffs with 4-1—5 in 4 GP.
- \* Paced all Wheat Kings rookies in assists and points with 4-10—14 in 55 GP during the 2022-23 season.
- \* Was the fourth overall pick in the 2021 WHL Bantam Draft.
- \* Won gold with Team Canada at the 2024 Under-18 World Championship and 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, where he posted the third-most goals and fourth-most points (tied) among his fellow countrymen (4-3—7 in 5 GP). He also played at the 2022 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge, where he topped his team in points (tied; 4-4—8 in 6 GP).
- \* His father, **Scott**, played defense in the WHL with the Red Deer Rebels and Saskatoon Blades (6-9—15 in 88 GP).

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

Playing in his third full WHL season. An elite combination of size and skill. A huge center that can do it all. Has the ability to take over and dominate games with his high-end puck skills along with deceptive speed and quickness. Can create his own shots and set up chances for teammates. Excellent puck control and can dangle to beat defenders off the rush with speed and in traffic. Great playmaking and a touch with the puck to finesse it through tight spots and onto teammates sticks. A high compete level with an imposing frame, he can play both a skilled and physical game to battle and power his way through checks to make plays. Can play with an edge and will stand up for his teammates.

KASHAWN AITCHESON
Defense | Barrie (OHL)
Born: Scarborough, Ont.
No. 9-ranked North American Skater

- \* Tied the eighth-most points in a single season by a Barrie Colts defenseman in franchise history after posting 26-33—59 (64 GP). He owned the third-most goals among all blueliners across the OHL this season and the seventh-most points. Aitcheson also finished as his team's overall scoring leader.
- \* Collected 8-31—39 (64 GP) in 2023-24 to finish fifth on his team in assists and points. It marked a 36-point improvement from his rookie campaign where he tallied three points through 23 games.
- \* Helped Team CHL sweep the 2024 CHL USA Prospects Challenge, with a performance that included scoring in the second game.
- \* Won gold with Canada at the 2024 Under-18 World Championship (1-2—3 in 7 GP).

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

A third-year OHL defenseman who will be a very versatile option for any team. A good skater with solid puck skills. The quarterback for Barrie's power play and has some flare offensively. On the defensive side, he can also be a shut down, in-your-face type player. A fierce competitor that plays with grit, along with good detail in his defensive game, gap control and awareness. Plays a physical style and will back it up. A very good defenseman who ticks a lot of boxes for the next level.

CARTER BEAR
Left Wing | Everett (WHL)
Born: Winnipeg, Man.
No. 10-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Concluded the 2024-25 season tied for seventh in goals and second in game winners (also tied) across the WHL after tallying 40-42—82 in 56 GP. Bear became just the sixth different player in Everett Silvertips history to score 40 in a single season.
- \* Represented Team CHL at the 2024 CHL USA Prospects Challenge and helped his team earn a victory over Team USA's NTDP.
- \* Collected 25-32—57 (67 GP) in 2023-24, to finish fifth in goals by a rookie across the WHL and seventh in points.
- \* In 2022-23, he won Winnipeg AAA's Under-18 MVP and top forward, while posting 32-27—59 (31 GP) and captaining his team.

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

In his second full year in the WHL and is now a top line winger on a good Everett team. A versatile player who can play center but looks best suited on the wing. Has grown in size and strength which is noticeable on the ice. Skates well and has a good base to build upon. An asset on special teams, he plays bumper on the power play and is deployed on the penalty kill. A high compete level and hounds the puck in all zones to create turnovers. Goes hard on plays and finishes his checks. Can play up and down the lineup and is proving to be an offensive scoring threat in the WHL with good hands and moves in tight to generate chances.

BRADY MARTIN
Center | Sault Ste. Marie (OHL)
Born: Elmira, Ont.
No. 11-ranked North American Skater

- \* Averaged 1.26 points per game to finish with the second-most points on his team with 33-39—72 (57 GP) after posting 11 three-point games, two four-point outings and a five-point performance. Martin's totals were a 44-point improvement from his rookie campaign.
- \* Represented Canada at the 2024 CHL USA Prospects Challenge, where he notched one goal in two games.
- \* Ranked sixth in points among all OHL skaters age 16 or younger in 2023-24 with 10-18—28 in 52 GP with the Greyhounds.
- \* Won gold with Canada at the 2025 Under-18 World Championship, where he wore an 'A' for his team and finished tied for fifth in tournament scoring (3-8—11 in 7 GP), as well as at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup (0-4—4 in 5 GP). He also represented Canada Red at the 2023 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (2-1—3 in 7 GP).

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

A top line center that has really come into his own this season. Plays big minutes and in all situations for Sault Ste Marie. Lots of natural talent with great smarts and game habits; plays a responsible 200-foot game. Effective playing physical and in the trenches. He possesses good offensive tools with his vision, instincts, creativity and finishing touch. The type of player you want on the ice when the game is on the line. Checks all the boxes and has no holes in his game – a natural leader by example.

LOGAN HENSLER
Defense | Univ. of Wisconsin (NCAA)
Born: Woodbury, Minn.
No. 12-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Amassed 2-10—12 (32 GP) as a freshman with Univ. of Wisconsin. He tied for the third-most points by a defenseman age 18 or younger across the NCAA.
- \* Named to the 2024-25 NCAA (B1G) All-Rookie team.
- \* Hensler finished second in scoring among defensemen on USA Hockey's National Development Program's Under-18 Team in 2023-24 (4-28—32 in 61 GP) behind **Cole Hutson**, who was drafted by the Capitals 43rd overall in 2024. He also did so the previous season when skating for the Under-17 team (5-23—28 in 60 GP), highlighted by a stretch of 15 games where he was held off the score sheet just twice.
- \* Won gold twice on the international stage, including at the 2025 World Junior Championship (0-1—1 in 7 GP) and the 2022 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (0-5—5 in 7 GP), where he finished third in tournament assists among defensemen. He also has a silver medal from the 2024 Under-18 World Championship (1-5—6 in 6 GP), tied for third in scoring by blueliners.

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

Played top pair minutes and on special teams in his first college season. A very smooth, effortless skater who can lead the rush and close out quickly while defending. Has a very calm and poised puck game and finds his options to make the correct pass. Smart, heads-up game at the offensive blue line finding the shooting or passing lanes and able to adapt or recover quickly when needed. Impressive season for a young player with the way he made the adjustment to the college game. Combination of size, smarts and skill make him one of the more complete defensemen in this Draft class.

JACKSON SMITH
Defense | Tri-City (WHL)
Born: Calgary, Alta.
No. 13-Ranked North American Skater

- \* Finished 10th in scoring among defensemen across the WHL after posting 11-43—54 (68 GP) this season, while his assist total ranked tied for ninth in the same category.
- \* The last Tri-City defenseman to finish with as many points in a season as Smith in 2024-25 was **Lukas Dragicevic** (75 in 2022-23), who went on to be drafted 57th overall in 2023.
- \* He tallied 8-21—29 (62 GP), for the fourth-most points by a rookie defenseman during the 2023-24 season.
- \* Selected second overall in the 2022 Bantam Draft.
- \* Won gold at the 2025 Under-18 World Championship and tied the tournament lead in goals by a defenseman (4). He also collected two assists in Canada's gold medal entry at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup and represented Canada Red at the 2023 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (0-2—2 in 7 GP).
- \* His father, **Wade**, played parts of four seasons in the WHL, including 15 games with the Tri-City Americans.

## **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

A top pair defenseman who plays a lot of minutes and in all situations. Runs special teams on the first power-play and penalty-kill units. Possesses good physical attributes that will make him a force to be reckoned with when he physically matures – looks to finish hits and punish opponents when he gets the opportunity. Excellent skater that has speed, quickness and mobility. Can skate the puck out of his zone under pressure and can beat defenders one-on-one. Strong game and presence at the offensive blue line, makes good choices and has the skill set to make plays and get shots off. Plays a solid all-around game that translates well to today's NHL.

LYNDEN LAKOVIC
Left Wing | Moose Jaw (WHL)
Born: Kelowna, B.C.
No. 14-ranked North American Skater

- \* Tallied 27-31—58 in 47 GP to finish with the fifth-highest point-per-game rate (1.23) among draft eligible WHL players. His season featured a 13-game point streak tied for the 11th longest across the WHL to help him finish atop his team in scoring by a 10-point margin.
- \* Played in both games of the 2024 CHL USA Prospects Challenge, including scoring the opening goal in Game 1 and assisting on the insurance marker (1-1—2 in 2 GP).
- \* Collected 18-21—39 (68 GP) in 2023-24, a 32-point improvement from his rookie campaign (2-5—7 in 37 GP in 2022-23). He also tallied 5-3—8 (20 GP) in Moose Jaw's run to the 2024 WHL Champion.
- \* Represented Team Canada Black at the 2022 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (1-2—3 in 7 GP).
- \* His uncle, **Sasha**, appeared in 37 NHL games from 1996-97 to 1998-99 with the Flames and Devils and his other uncle, **Greg**, played professional hockey in the IHL, ECHL, CHL and AHL.

#### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

Brings an excellent package of size, skating and skill. A high-end offensive winger that can both set up plays and finish. A strong skater and puck carrier who is able to transport the puck up ice with speed and create scoring chances. Has the ability to break down and beat defenders one-on-one with his pull-away speed and outstanding puck skills. A volume shooter who gets lots of shots on net and is able to get his shot off in multiple ways. Possesses very good vision and creativity with the puck, giving his team a big time power-play asset. A prototypical NHL power forward complemented with a high-end skill set.

JACK NESBITT
Center | Windsor (OHL)
Born: Sarnia, Ont.
No. 15-ranked North American Skater

Physically, he could improve his strength and toughness, especially when facing stronger opponents. Has made significant progress during the season. His best games show his ability to take on a leadership role and contribute at both ends and off the ice.

MAX WESTERGARD
Left Wing | Frolunda Jr. (SWEDEN-JR)
Born: Tampere, Finland
No. 30-Ranked International Skater

- \* After playing six games in Sweden's Under-18 league, Westergard skated in 41 games in the country's top junior league where he tallied 19-31—50 to finish third in assists and fifth in points among skaters age 17 or younger.
- \* Made his professional hockey debut in 2024-25, playing four regular-season and 11 playoff games (1-2—3) in Sweden's top professional league. He completed the postseason with the second-most points by an SHL player age 17 or younger.
- \* Played in two of Sweden's Under-18 leagues in 2023-24, including averaging 2.36 points per game in their top Under-18 league and finishing with the most points and assists among J18 Nationell skaters with 12-21—33 in 14 GP.

With added strength, better willingness to drive inside, and continued development, he has the tools to become a high-level finesse forward.

No. 2-Ranked North American Goaltender

- \* As a rookie, Beckman concluded the 2024-25 regular season with the most wins among all QMJHL goaltenders after posting a 31-18-2 record with a .914 save percentage (t-3rd highest) and 2.65 goals against average (5th lowest).
- \* His 52 appearances this past season were tied for the third most among all QMJHL netminders and the most among rookie goaltenders. No. 4-Ranked North American Goaltender

- \* Accumulated a 25-12-5 record with the Brampton Steelheads this past season and ranked in the top 10 among all OHL goaltenders in wins (9th), goals against average (3.05; 8th) and save percentage (.903; t-9th).
- \* Posted a 14-5-4 record as a rookie in 2023-24 (2.72 GAA, .915 SV%, 1 SO) to win the OHL Best Rookie GAA (Dinty Moore Trophy).
- \* Earned gold with Canada at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup and the 2025 Under-18 World Championship, where he concluded the tournament as the best goaltender after having the best save percentage (.961) and goals against average (1.05). Has decent reaction and recovery quickness. Decent feet and lateral ability. Good butterfly coverage. Seals the ice well in tight and on the post. His overall skill level kept improving as the season moved along. Lots of propotential - good NHL goalie prospect.

PYOTR ANDREYANOV
Goaltender | CSKA Jr. (RUSSIA-JR)
Born: Volsk, Russia
No. 1-Ranked International Goaltender

- \* Posted a 23-6-6 record while playing in Russia's junior league. His win total finished tied for the fourth highest across the league, while his save percentage was the third best at .942 and his goals against average was the sixth lowest (1.75).
- \* Andreyanov was selected to play in the MHL All-Star game this past season and was named the league's goaltender of the month twice.

While he isn't flashy, his calm and efficient play helps him control the game, giving him a composed NHL-like presence in the net. He occasionally overplays situations, particularly on second-chance opportunities, which affects his structure and rebound control. His numbers this season have been excellent, highlighting his consistency and reliability. He could develop into a high-level goaltender with some refinement to his game, particularly in managing his aggressiveness. An intriguing prospect with great size, strong fundamentals, and room to grow.

ELIJAH NEUENSCHWANDER
Goalie | Fribourg Jr. (SWISS-JR.)
Born: Biel-Bienne, Switzerland
No. 3-Ranked International Goaltender

- \* Spent the bulk of his season with HC Fribourg-Gotteron in Switzerland's highest level of junior hockey where he posted a 2.24 goals against average and an 11-5-0 record through 17 GP. He also played nine games with EHC Chur in the SL, Switzerland's second professional league, where he recorded a .909 save percentage, 2.67 goals against average and 6-2-1 record.
- \* Led all goalies age 17 or younger in wins and games played in the Swiss League for the 2024-25 season.
- \* Played three games for Switzerland at the 2025 World Junior Championship (.817 SV%, 5.17 GAA). He also was a member of Team Switzerland at the 2024 Under-18 World Championship.

Considered one of the top Swiss goalie prospects and could rise further with improved consistency and skating.

MANS GOOS
Goalie | Farjestad Jr. (SWEDEN-JR.)
Born: Vasteras, Sweden
No. 4-Ranked International Goaltender

- \* Played for the Farjestad's junior team in 2024-25 where he posted an .893 save percentage, 3.17 goals against average and an 11-12-0 record through 24 GP.
- \* His 24 games played ranked second among all goaltenders age 17 or younger in Sweden's top junior league behind **Isak Sorqvist** (34 GP).
- \* Spent most of the 2023-24 season in Sweden's under-18 league, where he posted a 14-10-0 record tied for the fifth-most wins among all netminders.

With continued development and experience, he projects as a solid pro-level goaltender with potential for more.

Born: Stockholm, Sweden
No. 5-Ranked International Goaltender

- \* Helped the Skelleftea junior team skate to a silver medal in 2024-25, recording a 10-9-0 record over 19 GP (.895 SV%, 3.31 GAA, 1 SO). He started the season with Lulea HF's junior team (.927 SV%, 2.28 GAA).
- \* In 2023-24, Harenstam posted a 7-4-0 record and finished the season tied for the sixth-highest save percentage (.905) across Sweden's top junior league.

His lateral quickness and post-to-post movement are strong, allowing him to adjust to sudden plays. Communicates well with his teammates and confidently plays the puck behind the net. Reading the game and anticipating plays is one of his biggest strengths. His consistency and poise are evident. His overall game continues to develop, but improving his patience and controlling his movements could make him even more effective. A solid prospect with the potential to grow into a reliable goaltender at higher levels
