2025 NAVY FEDERAL CREDIT UNION NHL STADIUM SERIES

All Statistics Through Games Played Feb. 24

- * The League's first outdoor game in the state of Ohio and first involving the Blue Jackets will breathe new life into the legendary football rivalry between the national champion Ohio State Buckeyes and Michigan Wolverines when Columbus hosts Detroit in the 2025 Navy Federal Credit Union NHL Stadium Series at Ohio Stadium on Saturday, March 1 (6 p.m. ET, ESPN, ESPN+, Disney+, FX-CA, Sportsnet+, TVAS).
- * Crucial standings points will be on the line at "The Shoe" as Columbus and Detroit look to break away from the peloton in the Eastern Conference's Wild Card race. The Red Wings occupied the first Wild Card spot through games of Feb. 24, while the Blue Jackets sat two points back of Detroit as each team aims to end a lengthy postseason drought.
- * Only three outdoor games in NHL history have involved teams within two points of each other and also battling for the final two playoff spots in their conference: the 2015 Stadium Series featuring San Jose (WC2) and Los Angeles, which was two points back of the Sharks; the 2014 Winter Classic between Detroit (WC1) and Toronto (WC2), who were tied at 45 points; and the 2008 Winter Classic, where Pittsburgh occupied seventh place in the Eastern Conference and was two points ahead of Buffalo.
- * Columbus has occupied a postseason spot or been the first team outside of the Eastern Conference's playoff picture through 46 of 49 dates since Jan. 7 as the Blue Jackets look to reach the Stanley Cup Playoffs for the first time since 2020. Detroit went 16-5-2 in 23 games after making a head coaching change on Dec. 26 and aims to clinch a postseason berth for the first time since its historic 25-year streak ended in 2016.
- * Detroit will contest its fifth outdoor game in franchise history, following wins in the 2016 Stadium Series at Coors Field and 2009 Winter Classic at Wrigley Field. The Red Wings also suffered an overtime loss in the 2017 Centennial Classic at Exhibition Stadium and a shootout defeat in the 2014 Winter Classic at Michigan Stadium. Detroit (2-0-2 in 4 GP) can become the fifth franchise with at least three wins in outdoor games, after the NY Rangers (5-0-0 in 5 GP), Boston (4-1-0 in 5 GP), St. Louis (3-0-0 in 3 GP) and Washington (3-1-0 in 4 GP).
- * Columbus and Detroit competed in the Central Division for 12 seasons from 2000-01 through 2012-13, and then in the Discover Central Division during the 2020-21 campaign. The Blue Jackets have played more games (113 GP) and earned more wins (46) against the Red Wings than any other team in their franchise history.



- * **Zach Werenski** and **Dylan Larkin** starred as teammates for USA at the 4 Nations Face-Off and now will face each other as opponents in the NHL's next notable event just a week later.
- * Werenski, **Adam Fantilli**, **Kirill Marchenko**, **Boone Jenner** and several other players can make their outdoor game debuts with Columbus. Werenski and Fantilli are two of many former Wolverines who could skate for the Blue Jackets or Red Wings on March 1, while **Jack Johnson** is one of a dozen Michigan alumni who went on to win the Stanley Cup and has a family connection to a decorated erstwhile Buckeyes linebacker.

- * Lucas Raymond and Moritz Seider also are set to make their outdoor game debuts and can do so alongside several veterans of such contests, including Larkin, Patrick Kane and Vladimir Tarasenko, who each can climb various all-time lists.
- * **Johnny Gaudreau** and his brother, **Matthew**, will be honored at the event and there are also plans to celebrate the Buckeyes' national champion football, women's hockey and spirit programs.

- * Zach Werenski, Adam Fantilli, Kirill Marchenko, Boone Jenner and several other Columbus players could make their outdoor game debuts. James van Riemsdyk (3-3—6 in 7 GP), Dante Fabbro (1-0—1 in 2 GP), Sean Kuraly (1-0—1 in 2 GP), Zach Aston-Reese (0-1—1 in 1 GP), Sean Monahan (0-1—1 in 1 GP), Ivan Provorov (0-1—1 in 3 GP) and Jack Johnson (1 GP) are the only current Blue Jackets players with experience in such contests.
- * Werenski ranks second in goals and points among defensemen this season. He could extend his home point streak to 23 games before the Stadium Series, which would mark the longest in NHL history by a player entering an outdoor contest (he would surpass **Sidney Crosby**, who had a 19-game streak ahead of the 2011 Winter Classic at Heinz Field). Werenski also would become the third defenseman in League history with a run of that length, joining **Bobby Orr** (25 GP from Oct. 13, 1974 Jan. 23, 1975) and **Paul Coffey** (23 GP from Nov. 27, 1985 Feb. 24, 1986). (Note: Home/road streaks on Records.NHL.com exclude neutral-site games.)
- * Werenski is the franchise's all-time leader in goals, assists and points by a defenseman. He can become the 10th player in NHL history to contest an outdoor game with a franchise as that team's all-time scoring leader among blueliners (also **Dustin Byfuglien**, **Drew Doughty**, **Vince Dunn**, **Victor Hedman**, **Roman Josi**, **Erik Karlsson**, **Kris Letang**, **Nicklas Lidstrom** and **Shea Theodore**). Lidstrom, who now is Detroit's vice president of hockey operations, topped the Red Wings' all-time leaderboard entering the 2009 Winter Classic at Wrigley Field.
- * Fantilli was chosen by Columbus with the No. 3 pick in the 2023 NHL Draft and his 28 career goals are the fourth-most in franchise history among players age 20 or younger, behind **Rick Nash** (58 in 154 GP), **Pierre-Luc Dubois** (47 in 164 GP) and **Cole Sillinger** (32 in 220 GP). Fantilli's total includes three tallies from when he scored his first career hat trick with his parents in attendance on Jan. 22.
- * Marchenko has enjoyed a breakout season and owns a two-goal edge on **Kent Johnson** and **Dmitri Voronkov** for the team lead. Marchenko became the first player in franchise history with three consecutive 20-goal campaigns from the start of his career.

- * Jenner, who made his season debut on Feb. 22, was chosen by Columbus with the No. 37 pick in the 2011 NHL Draft and is contesting his franchise-record 12th season with the Blue Jackets. Jenner has donned the "C" in each of the last four campaigns and is one of seven captains in franchise history.
- * van Riemsdyk is set to appear in his NHL-record eighth career outdoor game as well as his third against Detroit. His six points in such contests are the third-most in League history behind **Jonathan Toews** (2-5—7 in 6 GP) and former Red Wings captain **Henrik Zetterberg** (0-7—7 in 4 GP).

- * Lucas Raymond and Moritz Seider are set to make their outdoor game debuts. Seider (No. 6 in 2019) and Raymond (No. 4 in 2020) were first-round picks by Detroit in the NHL Draft and rank third and second, respectively, in team scoring since making their League debuts during the 2021-22 season.
- * Seider has skated in all 303 games contested by Detroit since his NHL debut on Oct. 14, 2021. His 167 points were the third-most among Red Wings defensemen through 300 career games behind **Reed Larson** (238) and **Nicklas Lidstrom** (190).
- * **Dylan Larkin** (1-0—1 in 2 GP) is the only Detroit player who skated with the Red Wings in the 2017 Centennial Classic at Exhibition Stadium or 2016 Stadium Series at Coors Field. Larkin logged a third-period goal in the Red Wings' last outdoor game and can become the fourth player in franchise history with two tallies in such contests, following **Jiri Hudler** (2 in 1 GP), **Anthony Mantha** (2 in 1 GP) and **Justin Abdelkader** (2 in 2 GP).
- * Patrick Kane (1-2—3 in 6 GP) can become the second player in NHL history to appear in seven outdoor games, joining Columbus forward James van Riemsdyk (7 GP). Kane skated with Chicago in the 2019 Winter Classic at Notre Dame Stadium, 2017 Winter Classic at Busch Stadium, 2016 Stadium Series at TCF Bank Stadium, 2015 Winter Classic at Nationals Park, 2014 Stadium Series at Soldier Field and 2009 Winter Classic at Wrigley Field.



- * **Alex DeBrincat** skated alongside Kane in the 2019 Winter Classic at Notre Dame Stadium and reunited with his longtime teammate when Kane signed with Detroit on Nov. 28, 2023. DeBrincat leads the Red Wings with 26 tallies this season and has reached the 20-goal mark in seven of his eight career campaigns.
- * Vladimir Tarasenko (3-0—3 in 2 GP) and van Riemsdyk can become the third and fourth players in NHL history with four career goals in outdoor games, following **David Pastrnak** (4 in 3 GP) and **Tyler Toffoli** (4 in 3 GP). Tarasenko tallied once with St. Louis in the 2022 Winter Classic at Target Field and twice for the Blues in the 2017 Winter Classic at Busch Stadium.



- * Werenski was born in Grosse Pointe, Mich., and played minor hockey with Belle Tire and Little Caesars before joining USA Hockey's National Team Development Program. The NTDP is based out of Plymouth, Mich., and has produced plenty of NHL stars, including fellow Wolverines alumni Compher, Copp, J. Johnson and Motte.
- * Larkin was born in Waterford, Mich., and played alongside Werenski as well as Compher, Copp and Motte during his one season with the Wolverines. Larkin has donned the "C" for Detroit for each of the last five seasons and became the first Michigan-born captain in franchise history.
- * K. Johnson hit "The Michigan" against the Islanders on March 24, 2023, and is one of four players to score a lacrosse-style goal since the cradle shot type officially began being tracked by the NHL starting in 2022-23. The nickname originates from when former Wolverines forward **Mike Legg** famously pulled off the move versus the Minnesota Golden Gophers on March 24, 1996.
- * Compher and J. Johnson won a Stanley Cup with the 2022 Avalanche. They are two of 12 former Wolverines players with at least one Stanley Cup in NHL history (also **Red Berenson**, **Andrew Cogliano**, **Carl Hagelin**, **Pat Hughes**, **Mike Knuble**, **John Madden**, **Kevin Porter**, **John Sherf**, **Blake Sloan** and **Aaron Ward**).
- * J. Johnson earned his general studies degree from Michigan just before winning the Stanley Cup, fulfilling a promise he made to former Wolverines head coach Berenson. Johnson's in-laws are Columbus native and former NFL quarterback **Brady Quinn**, Olympic silver medal-winning gymnast **Alicia Quinn** and **A.J. Hawk**, who won a Super Bowl as a linebacker with the Green Bay Packers and a national championship in his home state with the Buckeyes.

- * Bruins teammates Mason Lohrei (2021-22 to 2022-23) and Georgii Merkulov (2021-22), Canadiens goaltender Jakub Dobes (2021-22 to 2023-23), Canucks forward Dakota Joshua (2015-16 to 2018-19), Golden Knights forward Tanner Laczynski (2016-17 to 2019-20), and Lightning goaltender Matt Tomkins (2013-14 to 2016-17) are the six former Buckeyes who have played at least one NHL game this season.
- * Columbus has had five former Buckeyes play at least one game in franchise history, including R.J. Umberger and Nate Guenin. Umberger scored the first playoff goal in Blue Jackets history – against the Red Wings in Game 1 of the 2009 Conference Quarterfinals - while Guenin served as Ohio State's assistant coach last season.



OTHER TIES TO OHIO, MICHIGAN AMONG COLUMBUS, DETROIT PLAYERS

- Sean Kuraly was born in Niagara Falls, N.Y., but raised in the Columbus suburb of Dublin and played minor hockey for the Ohio Blue Jackets as well as four seasons with the Miami RedHawks program from 2012-13 to 2015-16. Miami is located approximately 100 miles southwest of Columbus in Oxford, Ohio.
- * Cole Sillinger was born in Columbus after his father, Mike, concluded his second and final campaign with the Blue Jackets. Cole's older brother, **Owen** (who was born in Regina), signed with the Blue Jackets on July 1, 2024, and made his NHL debut with Columbus on Jan. 9.



- * Alex DeBrincat was born in Farmington Hills, Mich., and played minor hockey with the Victory Honda program before a decorated junior career with the OHL's Erie Otters, who are located approximately 200 miles from Columbus. DeBrincat competed against current teammate **Joe Veleno** at the 2017 Memorial Cup before reaching the NHL.
- * **Jeff Petry** was born in Ann Arbor, Mich., just four days after his father, **Dan**, was traded by the Detroit Tigers to the California Angels. The younger Petry, who has been sidelined since Jan. 2, became the second player in NHL history whose dad was in the MLB and one a few with a father who played in any of the other major North America pro sports leagues.



- * **Dominik Shine** was born in Pinckney, Mich., and played parts of four seasons with the Northern Michigan Wildcats (2013-14 to 2016-17) as well as nine with the AHL's Grand Rapids Griffins (2013-14 to 2024-25) before making his NHL debut at age 31 on Jan. 27.
- * **Sheldon Dries** was born in Macomb, Mich., and played four seasons with the Western Michigan Broncos from 2013-14 to 2016-17. His cousin, **Danny**, played two seasons with the Ohio State Buckeyes from 2010-11 to 2011-12 and his uncle, **Ray**, served as captain of the Michigan Wolverines during the 1984-85 season.
- * Kuraly, **Christian Fischer**, **Patrick Kane**, **Kevin Labanc**, **James van Riemsdyk** and **Austin Watson** also skated with USA Hockey's National Team Development Program.

BY THE NUMBERS

- **18,034** Registered hockey players in Ohio last season, per USA Hockey. That represents a nearly 5,000-player increase from 20 years ago (four seasons after the Blue Jackets' debut), including a jump from 767 to 1,894 for female participants.
- **1998** Year that Columbus' president of hockey operations, general manager and alternate governor **Don Waddell** won the Stanley Cup as an assistant general manager with Detroit.
- 992 Players who have appeared in at least one outdoor game in NHL history (929 skaters and 63 goaltenders).
- **313** Yards rushed by decorated former Michigan running back **Tim Biakabutuka** against Ohio State on Nov. 25, 1995. Biakabutuka's nephew, **Jeremie**, skated in a preseason game with the Red Wings on Sept. 28, 2022, as well as in three contests with the AHL's Grand Rapids Griffins from April 10-15, 2023.
- **302** Players who have appeared in at least one NHL game this season who played for an NCAA program, including 30 with the Wolverines and six for the Buckeyes.



- **231** Passing yards by Ohio State quarterback **Will Howard** in the Buckeyes' national championship-clinching win against Notre Dame on Jan. 20. Columbus players <u>wore Ohio State jerseys</u> before the Blue Jackets' game against the Islanders that night, a few days after Wolverines alumni **Adam Fantilli**, **Kent Johnson** and **Dylan Larkin** opted not to after being <u>pranked</u> by <u>Fanatics</u>.
- **220.79** Miles skated by **Zach Werenski** this season according to NHL EDGE, the second-highest total among all players and nearly 1.5x the distance between Columbus and Detroit (164 miles).
- **141** Pick used by the Canadiens in the 1986 NHL Draft to select **Lyle Odelein**, who later became the Blue Jackets' first captain. Odelein was chosen 10 picks ahead of Ohio State's current head coach **Steve Rohlik** (No. 151 by PIT).
- **140** Games that **Cole** and **Owen Sillinger**'s father, **Mike**, played for the Red Wings across parts of four seasons from 1990-91 to 1994-95 (regular season and playoffs). Detroit was the first of 12 franchises that the eldest Sillinger skated with during his 17-season career, which mark the most by one player in NHL history.
- **43** Outdoor games in NHL history including the 2025 Stadium Series, with two more scheduled for next season when the Panthers play host to the Rangers in the 2026 Winter Classic at loanDepot park and the Bruins visit the Lightning for the 2026 Stadium Series at Raymond James Stadium.
- **41** Saves that **Jet Greaves** made with the ECHL's Kalamazoo Wings in their 3-2 shootout win outdoors against **Alex DeBrincat**'s brother, **Andrew**, and the Toledo Walleye at Fifth Third Field in Toledo on Dec. 26, 2021. Greaves also backstopped the AHL's Cleveland Monsters to a 3-2 overtime victory outdoors versus the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins at FirstEnergy Stadium in Cleveland on March 4, 2023, while **Jake Christiansen** and **Owen Sillinger** each had an assist.
- **27** Combined minutes of ice time logged by Red Wings prospect **Kienan Draper** and 2025 NHL Draft hopeful **Will Horcoff** with the Wolverines during their 4-3 loss outdoors against the Buckeyes at Wrigley Field on Jan. 3. Draper's father, **Kris**, and Horcoff's dad, **Shawn**, currently are assistant general managers with Detroit.
- **26** Outdoor NHL games played at football venues including the 2025 Stadium Series. The 17 others took place in baseball parks (14 GP), atop a golf course (2 GP) and at a soccer stadium (1 GP).
- **25** Age (in years) of the Blue Jackets' mascot **Stinger**, who helped promote the 2025 Stadium Series when he joined <u>ESPN's "College GameDay"</u> at Ohio Stadium before the Buckeyes beat the Hoosiers on Nov. 23, 2024.
- **24** Team-leading goal total by **Joy Dunne** with the Ohio State women's hockey program last season, including the national championship-clinching tally against Wisconsin with 7:12 remaining in regulation on March 24, 2024. Dunne's brother, **Josh**, played parts of two seasons with Columbus from 2020-21 to 2022-23.
- **19** Goals scored by "The Michigan" originator **Mike Legg** with the ECHL's Columbus Chill during the 1998-99 season. The Chill contested eight campaigns from 1991-92 to 1998-99 and were known for their creative marketing tactics as well as their loyal fanbase, which helped with the NHL awarding a franchise to the city.

- **18** U.S. states that have hosted at least one outdoor NHL game including Ohio, with Florida set to become the 19th next season. Washington, D.C., and five Canadian provinces also have hosted.
- **10** Face-offs won by **J.T. Compher**'s sister, **Jesse**, when she helped the Badgers earn a 1-0 national championship-clinching win against the Buckeyes on March 19, 2023. Jesse has 7-7—14 in 20 games with the PWHL's Toronto Sceptres this season, including <u>a highlight-reel goal</u> against the Montreal Victoire on Dec. 21, 2024.







BUILDING AN ICE RINK FOR AN OUTDOOR NHL GAME

Constructing an NHL-caliber ice rink outdoors at a facility designed for a sport other than hockey is a unique challenge. Much more than taking a garden hose into your backyard and flooding an area, for its outdoor games, the National Hockey League uses special equipment, expertise and technology to create an ice rink fit for the best hockey players in the world.

The most important aspects of making outdoor ice for an NHL game are ensuring the conditions meet all of the safety standards required for the players and providing all of the tools necessary for an NHL game. To accommodate its outdoor games, the NHL designed and built a one-of-a-kind mobile refrigeration unit and rink system.

The main function of the 53-foot, 300-ton capacity refrigeration unit is to perform the key function of making a great sheet of ice – to remove heat from the surface and stabilize the temperature.

To do this, the unit pumps as much as 3,000 gallons of glycol coolant into custom-made aluminum trays that are configured on the field of the stadium. Running through a series of hoses from the refrigeration unit to the field, the glycol chills the trays in order to keep the ice near its ideal surface temperature of 22°F/6°C. Following the placement of the ice trays, the rink boards are installed.

Once the boards are up and the ideal surface temperature is attained, the actual process of building the ice begins. In an NHL arena, the ice is built to a thickness of approximately 1-1.25 inches. An outdoor rink, however, requires up to 2 inches of ice thickness to help withstand the more extreme elements. While many speculate that it takes special water to create the ice, the water used is the same tap water provided into everyone's homes.



Water is added as slowly as possible, in as fine a mist as the process will allow. Workers pass the spray wand over the ice rink hundreds of times, providing a more-even freeze and better-quality playing surface. Each inch of ice thickness requires approximately 10,000 gallons of water. For finishing touches, the ice surface is whitened using approximately 350 gallons of water-soluble paint. The lines and logos then are painted and placed on the surface, with more ice built on top.

Once constructed, monitoring the status of the ice is a 24-hour job. To help this process, a high-tech system called "Eye on the Ice" is embedded in the surface. The technology provides updates on temperatures at different areas of the ice, signaling an alert prompting the need to pump more glycol or engage the in-line heating system in case the weather gets too cold.
