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OVERVIEW

The NHL and NHLPA will host the 4 Nations Face-Off – featuring international tournament play among NHL players from Canada, Finland, Sweden and the United States – from Feb. 12-20, 2025.

Bell Centre in Montreal and TD Garden in Boston will serve as the host venues and cities for the seven-game tournament, which also will feature two designated training/practice days (Feb. 10-11).

The 4 Nations Face-Off will be broadcast exclusively in North America by The Walt Disney Company (ESPN/ABC), TNT Sports, Sportsnet and TVA Sports.

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SCHEDULE

Bell Centre in Montreal will host the first four games of the 4 Nations Face-Off (Feb. 12-15), capped by Canada facing the United States on Saturday, Feb. 15.

The 4 Nations Face-Off will shift to TD Garden in Boston for the final three contests of the tournament (Feb. 17-20), including the championship game on Thursday, Feb. 20.

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FORMAT

All seven games in the 4 Nations Face-Off will be played in accordance with NHL rules – with the exception of overtime, which will be 10 minutes instead of five for round-robin games.

Each team will play three total round-robin games under the following points system: three points for a win in regulation; two points for a win in overtime/shootout; one point for a loss in overtime/shootout; and zero points for a loss in regulation.

The two teams with the best round-robin record will advance to a one-game final, which will feature the overtime format of the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

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TIEBREAKERS

Two-Way Tie:

A tie in the standings between two teams shall be decided by the head-to-head result between those two tied teams.

Three-Way Tie:

The calculations for Steps 1-5 will be derived from ALL games played:

STEP 1: Total Points (three points for a win in regulation, two points for a win in OT or shootout, one point for a loss in OT or shootout; and zero points for a loss in regulation [or while the goalie is pulled in OT])

STEP 2: Regulation Wins (total of regulation wins only)

STEP 3: ROW (total of regulation and OT wins, excluding shootout wins)

STEP 4: Goal Differential (total goals for minus total goals against, taken from all games played)

STEP 5: Total Goals Scored (total goals for from all games played)

The calculations for Steps 6-9 will be derived from games played BETWEEN TIED TEAMS ONLY:

STEP 6: Goal Differential (total goals for minus total goals against in games between tied teams)

STEP 7: Total Goals Scored (total goals for in games between tied teams)

STEP 8: Most Even-Strength Goals For (in games between tied teams)

STEP 9: Fewest Even-Strength Goals Against (in games between tied teams)

Notes:

* In proceeding through the steps to break a three-way tie, the moment one team is either elevated to the championship game or eliminated from the tournament, the tie would immediately be broken by the head-to-head matchup between the remaining two tied teams (see two-way tie criteria above), and not by continuing with any additional steps.

* Of particular importance, teams who pull their goaltender for an extra attacker during the overtime period (other than on a delayed penalty) will be subject to the potential forfeiture of their one point earned for a tie score at the end of regulation, in the event the opposing team scores into the empty net.

* For purposes of tiebreaking procedures, shootouts will result in the awarding of +1 goal to the victor and -1 goal for the losing team.

4 NATIONS FACE-OFF ROSTERS AND NUMBERS

Each National Association – Hockey Canada, Finnish Ice Hockey Association, Swedish Ice Hockey Association and USA Hockey – selected its 23-player roster for the 4 Nations Face-Off (20 skaters and three goaltenders per team).

Each roster is comprised of players who are under an NHL contract for the 2024-25 season and were on an NHL roster as of Dec. 2, 2024.

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CHAMPION: CANADA

The third World Cup of Hockey featured eight teams, including two created specifically for the best-on-best international tournament: Team North America and Team Europe.

Team North America was comprised of players age 23 or younger from Canada and the United States, while Team Europe was a pan-European roster of players from birth countries outside of the Czech Republic, Finland, Russia and Sweden (who each iced its own team to compete alongside Canada and the United States – whose rosters included only players age 24 or older).

After training camps and pre-tournament games played in Canada, the Czech Republic, Finland, Russia, Sweden and the United States, the teams convened in Toronto for the two-week event.

Not yet named captain of the Edmonton Oilers, 19-year-old **Connor McDavid** wore the “C” for Team North America – whose roster included the likes of fellow future Hart Memorial Trophy winners **Nathan MacKinnon** (Colorado Avalanche) and **Auston Matthews** (Toronto Maple Leafs), the reigning No. 1 pick in the NHL Draft who had yet to make his League debut, along with future Vezina Trophy winner **Connor Hellebuyck** (Winnipeg Jets) as a third-string backup goaltender.

Team North America dazzled out of the gate, outscoring Team Europe 11-4 in its first two pre-tournament games before defeating Finland and Sweden in round-robin action. In what ended up as the final play in Team North America history, **Johnny Gaudreau** (Calgary Flames) found MacKinnon with a shot pass to set up a highlight-reel overtime goal against Sweden’s **Henrik Lundqvist** (New York Rangers).

Experience proved to be a factor as veteran-heavy Canada, Russia, Sweden and Team Europe advanced to the semifinals, where tournament MVP and “Captain Canada” **Sidney Crosby** (Pittsburgh Penguins) took over.

After a three-point showing to oust **Alex Ovechkin** (Washington Capitals) and Russia in the semifinals, Crosby factored on three of five Canadian goals across the two-game final against Team Europe. Crosby played alongside Boston Bruins teammates **Patrice Bergeron** and **Brad Marchand**, with the trio connecting on two goals in Game 1 of the final before Bergeron and Marchand staged a late Canadian rally in Game 2 with goals 2:09 apart in the final three minutes of regulation to secure the championship.

Canada posted a perfect 6-0-0 record and outscored opponents 24-8 en route to claiming its sixth championship in eight World Cup of Hockey/Canada Cup tournaments.

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MVP: SIDNEY CROSBY, CENTER, CANADA

Wearing the “C” for Canada three months after captaining the Pittsburgh Penguins to their second Stanley Cup (and winning his first Conn Smythe Trophy as playoff MVP), **Sidney Crosby** was a force at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey – momentum he continued into the 2016-17 NHL season.

Donning the maple leaf on home soil for the first time since scoring Canada’s “Golden Goal” at the 2010 Olympics in Vancouver, Crosby tallied 1-2—3 (including Canada’s opening goal of the tournament) in a 6-0 victory against the Czech Republic.

After being held off the scoresheet in a 4-2 triumph against the United States, Crosby again scored the opening goal against Team Europe to kickstart a 4-1 victory as Canada finished the round robin with a perfect 3-0-0 record atop Group A.

The trend continued into the semifinals against Russia and longtime rival **Alex Ovechkin** (Washington Capitals) as Crosby opened the scoring for a third time. After Russia took the lead, Crosby notched the primary assist on both the tying and go-ahead goals to rally Canada to victory.

In the best-of-three final against Team Europe, Crosby factored on three of five Canadian goals – all via assists on goals by linemates **Brad Marchand** and **Patrice Bergeron** (Boston Bruins teammates) – to help the host nation secure a championship.

Crosby (3-7—10 in 6 GP) led the tournament in assists and points to finish ahead of Marchand (5-3—8 in 6 GP) and Bergeron (4-3—7 in 6 GP), who rounded out the top three in scoring. Less than nine months later, Crosby added another Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy and consecutive Stanley Cup and Conn Smythe Trophy wins to his résumé.

2004 WORLD CUP OF HOCKEY

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CHAMPION: CANADA

The 2004 World Cup of Hockey was similar in format to the inaugural event in 1996.

Eight national teams were divided into two groups, with Canada, Russia, Slovakia and the United States forming the North American pool and playing round-robin/quarterfinal games in North America. The Czech Republic, Finland, Germany and Sweden formed the European pool and each hosted at least one game as the teams competed in Europe through the quarterfinals.

Strong goaltending efforts by **Miikka Kiprusoff** (Calgary Flames) and **Tomas Vokoun** (Nashville Predators) helped send Finland and the Czech Republic across the Atlantic Ocean for semifinal dates against the United States and Canada, respectively.

After outscoring opponents 15-3 through the quarterfinals, Canada required an overtime goal by tournament MVP **Vincent Lecavalier** (Tampa Bay Lightning) to defeat the Czech Republic in the semifinals. One day prior, Finland rallied past the United States to secure its first appearance in the final of a World Cup of Hockey/Canada Cup.

With the World Cup of Hockey/Canada Cup final back to a winner-take-all format for the first time since 1981, Canada returned to the winner's podium with a narrow victory against Finland.

Kiprusoff made 30 saves in the championship game but was outmatched by **Martin Brodeur** (New Jersey Devils; 29 SV), who won all five of his appearances and posted tournament-leading totals with his 1.00 goals-against average and .961 save percentage.

Canada claimed its fifth championship in seven tournaments, this time captained by 38-year-old **Mario Lemieux** (Pittsburgh Penguins) – who played in his final international event and went out in style by threading a cross-ice pass to set up **Joe Sakic** (Colorado Avalanche) for the opening goal just 52 seconds into the championship game.

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MVP: VINCENT LECAVALIER, CENTER, CANADA

One month after helping the Tampa Bay Lightning win their first Stanley Cup, **Vincent Lecavalier** was named to Canada's roster for the World Cup of Hockey to replace injured forward **Steve Yzerman** (Detroit Red Wings).

Lecavalier's addition paid dividends in the form of timely scoring and led to Canada's first title under the World Cup of Hockey banner.

After being held off the scoresheet in Canada's opening 2-1 victory against the United States, Lecavalier tallied three assists over the last two round-robin games – including helpers on the game-winning goal against both Slovakia (0-2—2 in 5-1 W) and Russia (0-1—1 in 3-1 W).

Lecavalier then delivered back-to-back 1-1—2 showings in the quarterfinals and semifinals, securing the game-winning goal in each contest – first in a 5-0 triumph against Slovakia and then in a 3-2 overtime victory against the Czech Republic.

Lecavalier's performance propelled Canada into the one-game final and made him the fourth player to score multiple game-winning goals in the medal round of a single World Cup of Hockey/Canada Cup, following **Mario Lemieux** (2 in 1987 CC), **Steve Larmer** (2 in 1991 CC) and **Tony Amonte** (2 in 1996 WCH).

Despite being held off the scoresheet in Canada's championship-clinching victory versus Finland, Lecavalier led Canada with 2-5—7 to finish second in tournament scoring behind Lightning teammate **Freddy Modin** (4-4—8) of Sweden.

1996 WORLD CUP OF HOCKEY

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CHAMPION: UNITED STATES

The first World Cup of Hockey was staged in August and September 1996 and featured an expanded international field with games on both sides of the Atlantic Ocean.

Eight national teams were divided into two groups, with Canada, Russia, Slovakia and the United States contesting round-robin play in North America and the Czech Republic, Finland, Germany and Sweden playing in Europe.

Canada and Russia emerged from the quarterfinals to set up semifinal showdowns against Sweden and the United States, respectively, after those countries received byes thanks to perfect 3-0-0 round-robin records.

Despite surrendering a two-goal lead in the third period against Sweden, Canada escaped with a double-overtime win to set up a championship round date with the United States, who later cruised to victory against Russia on the back of a two-goal showing from tournament scoring leader **Brett Hull** (St. Louis Blues; 7-4—11 in 7 GP).

In the all-North American final, the United States rallied to defeat Canada in a thrilling best-of-three series.

An overtime goal by **Steve Yzerman** (Detroit Red Wings) gave Canada the win in Game 1 in Philadelphia.

The United States won Games 2 and 3 in Montreal by identical 5-2 scores, backstopped by the tournament MVP goaltending of **Mike Richter** (New York Rangers).

The tournament-winning goal was scored by **Tony Amonte** (Chicago Blackhawks), who helped the United States rally from a third-period deficit in Game 3 by breaking a 2-2 tie with 2:35 remaining in regulation.

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MVP: MIKE RICHTER, GOALTENDER, UNITED STATES

Two years removed from backstopping the New York Rangers to their first Stanley Cup triumph in 54 years, **Mike Richter** put up another championship-caliber performance to help end another long wait – this time for his country.

Richter (5-1-0, 2.43 GAA, .923 SV%) played in six of seven games to help the United States claim its first title at a major senior international tournament since the 1980 Olympics.

Richter's MVP performance at the inaugural World Cup of Hockey included only two opponents, both deep-seated rivals: Canada and Russia.

In the team's tournament opener, Richter limited the production of Rangers teammates **Mark Messier** and **Wayne Gretzky** – who recently signed with New York – to secure a victory against Canada. Two days later, Richter made 32 saves in his home NHL arena, Madison Square Garden, to defeat Russia.

With a bye to the semifinals already clinched, Richter did not play in the round-robin finale against Slovakia but returned to the American crease to secure another 5-2 decision versus Russia as well as a spot in the final.

A 31-save effort fell short in Game 1 of the final against Canada, but Richter responded from his only defeat with back-to-back 35-save showings to close out the tournament and clinch the championship.

He made at least 30 saves four times, the second time he had done so at a World Cup of Hockey/Canada Cup (also four times in 1991). At the time, the only other goaltender with at least four 30-save efforts in a single tournament was Canada's **Grant Fuhr** (4x in 1987).

1991 CANADA CUP

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CHAMPION: CANADA

The 1991 Canada Cup signaled a shift in hockey's international order, with the first all-North American final in tournament history coming out of a semifinal round that featured Canada (3-0-2), the United States (4-1-0), Finland (2-2-1) and Sweden (2-3-0) as the top four teams emerging from the round-robin.

Led by **Mike Modano** (Minnesota North Stars), **Brett Hull** (St. Louis Blues), **Brian Leetch** (New York Rangers), **Pat LaFontaine** (New York Islanders) and goaltender **Mike Richter** (New York Rangers), the U.S. lost only to Canada in the round robin before cruising to a 7-3 semifinal win against Finland – a team playing past the round robin for the first time thanks in part to 21-year-old **Teemu Selanne**, one year prior to his thrilling NHL rookie season.

Sweden reached the Canada Cup semifinals for the third time (also 1984 and 1987) but was ousted by reigning champion Canada, which received a shutout from **Bill Ranford** (Edmonton Oilers) and the winning goal from **Wayne Gretzky** (Los Angeles Kings) to secure a spot in the final for the fifth time in as many events.

With 18 future Hockey Hall of Famers dressed between Canada (11) and the United States (7) during the two-game final, the Canadians emerged with their third consecutive Canada Cup title (fourth overall).

Steve Larmer (Chicago Blackhawks) led all players with six goals overall, with three coming in the final when he scored both game-winners for a Canadian team that trailed in only one of its eight total contests (vs. the Soviet Union).

Despite missing Game 2 of the final, Gretzky (4-8—12 in 7 GP) claimed his fourth tournament scoring title in as many appearances, boosting his career Canada Cup totals to 17-40—57 (31 GP).

MVP: WAYNE GRETZKY, CENTER, CANADA

Playing in his fourth Canada Cup and first since being traded to the Los Angeles Kings in 1988, **Wayne Gretzky** replicated his efforts in many ways, leading Canada to the final and finishing as the tournament scoring leader – just as he had done in his three prior appearances. This time, Gretzky achieved the feat despite missing the championship-clinching victory due to an injury suffered in Game 1 of the final.

Held off the scoresheet in Canada's opener against Finland, Gretzky responded by collecting 3-7—10 over the next three games – notching at least three points in each contest to spark Canada to a first-place finish in the round robin. He became the first player to record at least three consecutive three-point performances in the Canada Cup.

Gretzky's fifth point of the tournament also stood as his 50th career point at the event, the first player to reach that milestone (doing so in just 27 games).

Gretzky's streak ended when the Soviet Union held him at bay in the round-robin finale, but he then scored the game-winning goal in a 4-0 semifinal win against Sweden to spur Canada to its fifth straight championship appearance.

In what ended up being his last game of the tournament, Gretzky notched an assist on the winning goal in Game 1 of the final – his fifth point of the tournament against the United States following a 1-3—4 showing in the round robin – to finish as the leader with 4-8—12 (7 GP).

“The Great One” became the first player to be named Canada Cup MVP more than once, adding to his win four years prior.

1987 CANADA CUP

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CHAMPION: CANADA

The 1987 Canada Cup featured the emergence of **Mario Lemieux** (Pittsburgh Penguins) as a true superstar. Teamed with **Wayne Gretzky** (Edmonton Oilers), the combination of two of hockey's most gifted offensive players saw them combine for 39 points in nine games and resulted in some of the most exciting games in the sport's history.

Canada (3-0-2) did not suffer a loss in the round robin, with ties against Czechoslovakia (2-2-1) and the Soviet Union (3-1-1) serving as their only blemishes. Canada crossed paths with both teams again, first dispatching Czechoslovakia in the semifinals by rallying from a 2-0 deficit with three goals in 2:25. That set up a showdown with the Soviet Union in the tournament final for the second time, following the lopsided Soviet win at the 1981 Canada Cup.

An overtime goal by 21-year-old forward **Alexander Semak** in Game 1 put the Soviet Union within a victory of joining Canada as two-time champions. However, the top two scorers in the tournament took over from there as Gretzky (3-18—21 in 9 GP) and Lemieux (11-7—18 in 9 GP) teamed up for a pair of memorable moments in the remaining games.

Lemieux ended a classic Game 2 on a feed from Gretzky at 10:07 of the second overtime period. And then, with 1:26 remaining in regulation of the third and final game, Lemieux again converted a Gretzky pass for a Canada Cup-winning victory.

Lemieux broke the Canada Cup record for goals, while Gretzky did the same for assists and points to secure MVP honors after finishing as the top scorer for the third straight event.

MVP: WAYNE GRETZKY, CENTER, CANADA

Already an eight-time Hart Memorial Trophy winner and three-time Stanley Cup champion, **Wayne Gretzky** (Edmonton Oilers) brought his dominance to the international stage at his third Canada Cup – this time aided by **Mario Lemieux** (Pittsburgh Penguins) as a linemate. The two combined for 39 points in nine games, with Gretzky averaging 2.33 points per game and 2.00 assists per contest to shatter the single-tournament benchmarks for points (21) and assists (18).

Gretzky had multiple points in eight of nine games (a tournament record) – held off the scoresheet only during a 50-save performance by Finland goaltender **Kari Takko** (Minnesota North Stars) – including six multi-assist showings (also a tournament record).

Gretzky established yet another Canada Cup record in Game 2 of the final when he tallied five assists – including his helper on Lemieux's double-overtime winner – to support Canada's bid to tie the best-of-three series against the Soviet Union.

Gretzky and Lemieux connected again in Game 3 of the final, with “The Great One” setting up “Super Mario” for the iconic tiebreaking, championship-clinching goal with less than 90 seconds left in regulation.

Gretzky finished with more than double the assist total of any other player and a six-point lead in points over the next-closest opponent (**Sergei Makarov**: 7-8—15 in 9 GP for the Soviet Union) to secure a career first as MVP of the Canada Cup.

1984 CANADA CUP

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CHAMPION: CANADA

Though the 1984 Canada Cup took place just three years after the previous event, there were many differences both on the ice and in its format.

Among them was the debut of the West Germany team, which replaced Finland by virtue of a fifth-place finish at the most recent World Championship (Finland was seventh). Another change saw **Bryan Trottier** (New York Islanders), then a four-time Stanley Cup champion, cross the border, switching from Canada to the United States.

Trottier's presence, along with other NHL stars **Bob Carpenter** (Washington Capitals), **Joe Mullen** (St. Louis Blues), **Rod Langway** (Washington Capitals) and **Tom Barrasso** (Buffalo Sabres), helped the United States (3-1-1) to a second-place finish in the round robin. The reigning champion Soviet Union (5-0-0) topped the standings after becoming the first team in tournament history to emerge from the round robin with a perfect record – securing the feat with a 6-3 triumph against Canada.

Upsets in both semifinals flipped the script, however, as third-ranked Sweden (3-2-0) cruised to a 9-2 victory against the United States thanks to a combined nine points between **Kent Nilsson** (1-4—5) and **Hakan Loob** (3-1—4), also teammates with the Calgary Flames.

A rematch of the 1981 Canada Cup final also yielded a much different result as fourth-ranked Canada (2-2-1) avenged an 8-1 defeat from three years prior – and a loss 72 hours earlier – by defeating the Soviet Union 3-2 in overtime. **Mike Bossy** (New York Islanders) netted the winning tally for Canada.

As in 1976, the tournament final was a best-of-three, with Canada sweeping the series – also as in 1976.

Canada outscored Sweden 11-3 through the first 84:39 of the final and secured the championship after holding off a Swedish rally in Game 2 of the final that saw Nilsson (2-2—4) post his second four-point effort of the tournament. **Wayne Gretzky** (Edmonton Oilers; 5-7—12 in 8 GP) scored in each game of the final en route to leading the tournament in scoring for a second straight event.

MVP: JOHN TONELLI, LEFT WING, CANADA

The dedication and determination that helped **John Tonelli** claim four consecutive Stanley Cup wins with the New York Islanders was on full display at the 1984 Canada Cup as his style of play motivated the star-laden Canadian club to a championship.

Longtime rival **Wayne Gretzky** (Edmonton Oilers), the tournament scoring leader, credited Tonelli for his impact beyond the scoresheet, noting that in challenging moments “all we had to do was look at him scrapping and sacrificing everything he had to give.”

Tonelli notched two assists in Canada’s tournament-opening win, but was held without a point in its next two contests as the host nation slipped to 1-1-1. He then collected 0-2—2 against Czechoslovakia, with both assists coming in the opening 5:30 of the first period to spot Canada to an early lead. Tonelli followed that up with a goal in each of the team’s next two games, both go-ahead tallies against the Soviet Union, before assisting on the overtime goal by linemate and longtime Islanders teammate **Mike Bossy** in the semifinals.

Held off the scoresheet in the opening game of the best-of-three final, Tonelli closed the tournament with 1-1—2 in the clinching game to finish tied for the tournament lead with four multi-point showings overall (alongside **Paul Coffey**; Edmonton Oilers).

Tonelli tied for second on the team in scoring from the semifinals onward and was the only Canadian with two multi-point efforts in the elimination round. Tonelli effectively toed the line with his gritty style of play, never putting his team on the penalty kill across the eight games, and finished seventh overall in tournament scoring with 3-6—9.

1981 CANADA CUP

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CHAMPION: SOVIET UNION

The second Canada Cup featured the same six-team contingent as the first, with an updated format that included a semifinal round followed by a winner-take-all final. Canada (4-0-1) and the Soviet Union (3-1-1) finished first and second, respectively, through round-robin play to set up two rivalry matchups in the semifinals.

Led by a 20-year-old **Wayne Gretzky** (Edmonton Oilers), making his senior international debut on the heels of a 1980-81 season in which he set a then-NHL record with 164 points, the Canadians secured a 4-1 victory against the United States in the semifinals.

The Soviet Union roster featured a talented crop of newcomers, including **Alexei Kasatonov**, **Igor Larionov** and **Vladimir Krutov**, all 21 or younger, who helped propel them to a 4-1 semifinal victory against Czechoslovakia.

Squaring off against Gretzky (5-7—12 in 7 GP), the tournament scoring leader, and a Canadian roster that also featured **Mike Bossy**, **Bryan Trottier**, **Clark Gillies** and **Denis Potvin** of the two-time defending Stanley Cup champion New York Islanders, the Soviet Union shocked the Canadians and sold-out crowd at the Montreal Forum by dominating the one-game final.

Veteran goaltender **Vladislav Tretiak** (26 SV) held Gretzky off the scoresheet and the young trio of Kasatonov (0-3—3), Larionov (2-0—2) and Krutov (1-1—2) combined for seven points to support a **Sergei Shepelev** hat trick in an 8-1 victory. Tretiak was named tournament MVP after allowing only eight goals across six games, while Kasatonov (1-10—11 in 7 GP), a defenseman, finished one point behind Gretzky for the scoring lead.

MVP: VLADISLAV TRETIAK, GOALTENDER, SOVIET UNION

Playing in his second and final Canada Cup, veteran goaltender **Vladislav Tretiak** shone for the Soviet Union, posting a 1.33 goals-against average and .947 save percentage to lead the tournament by a wide margin in each category. No goaltender played more than Tretiak, who allowed more than one goal only once across six appearances and never lost en route to securing the championship.

Tretiak opened the event with a 23-save effort in a 1-1 tie against Czechoslovakia, whose netminder **Karel Lang** (2.64 GAA, .894 SV%) finished second behind Tretiak in both goals-against average and save percentage. Tretiak had a remarkable 1.31 advantage over Lang atop the goals-against average list and was the only netminder with a save percentage of .900 or higher – despite facing a tournament-high 151 shots against.

Tretiak served as the backup in the round-robin finale, a 7-3 defeat against Canada, but returned to the Soviet Union net for the elimination games, where he posted his best performances of the tournament.

The 29-year-old netminder made 26 saves in both the semifinal and final, holding the high-scoring Canadians (36 goals for entering the final) to a single tally in the championship game.

Tretiak yielded eight goals against in the entire tournament, outdone by only four goaltenders – all of whom played just one game.

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CHAMPION: CANADA

Created by the NHL, NHLPA and Hockey Canada in 1976, the Canada Cup gave NHL players a chance to represent their native countries for the first time.

With many predicting a Canada-Soviet Union final in a rematch of their epic 1972 Summit Series, the strong play of Czechoslovakia changed that narrative. Canada dominated through three round-robin games, outscoring opponents 19-4, but Czechoslovakia also got off to a strong start (2-0-1) before shocking the host nation with a 1-0 victory.

Canada (4-1-0) and Czechoslovakia (3-1-1) emerged as the top two teams from the round robin to secure spots in the final, where Canada avenged its earlier defeat by sweeping Czechoslovakia in the best-of-three series.

In Game 1, tournament MVP **Bobby Orr** (Chicago Black Hawks) tallied 2-1—3 to power the offensive support in front of a 24-save shutout by **Rogie Vachon** (Los Angeles Kings), who led all goaltenders in games played (7), wins (6), goals-against average (1.39) and shutouts (2).

In Game 2, star forward **Darryl Sittler** (Toronto Maple Leafs) scored the tournament-winning goal in overtime – a tally that remains an iconic moment in Canada’s international hockey history.

Among the 20 players to dress for Canada in the final, 17 were inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame (including 12 who also were named to the [NHL 100 Greatest Players](#)).

MVP: BOBBY ORR, DEFENSEMAN, CANADA

The star of the tournament for Canada was **Bobby Orr** (Chicago Black Hawks), who enjoyed a final turn in the spotlight before repeated knee injuries ended his brilliant career.

Orr shared the tournament scoring lead with nine points, tallying 2-7—9 in seven games to equal the output of Soviet Union forward **Victor Zhluktov** (5-4—9 in 5 GP) and fellow Canadian defenseman **Denis Potvin** (New York Islanders; 1-8—9 in 7 GP).

After being sidelined by injury for more than nine months, Orr made a triumphant return by collecting three assists in Canada’s opening game, an 11-2 victory against Finland. The 28-year-old defenseman added two more assists in a 4-2 win against the United States, including a helper on the opening goal by **Phil Esposito** (New York Rangers). Orr and Esposito had won two Stanley Cups over nine seasons as teammates with the Boston Bruins.

Orr added one more assist in the round robin, during a 4-0 triumph against Sweden, before leading Canada's offensive output with 2-1—3 in Game 1 of the final against Czechoslovakia. His MVP honor added to a résumé that already included multiple wins of the James Norris Memorial Trophy (8), Hart Memorial Trophy (3), Art Ross Trophy (2), Conn Smythe Trophy (2) and Stanley Cup (2).
