# NORTH AMERICAN SKATERS



## GAVIN McKENNA

Left Wing | Penn State (NCAA)

Born: Whitehorse, Y.T.

No. 1-Ranked North American Skater

\* McKenna finished fifth in scoring across the NCAA as a freshman after tallying 15-36—51 (35 GP) – 32 of which came in his final 17 games after the NHL's mid-season rankings was released. Every player above him has already been drafted to an NHL team. McKenna topped the league in assists per game (1.03) and finished second in points per game (1.46).

\* Won Big 10 Freshman of the Year, was a two-time National Rookie of the Month and was a top-10 finalist for the Hobey Baker Award.

\* Named CHL David Branch Player of the Year in 2024-25. At just 17 years, 5 months, and 24 days old, McKenna became the [third-youngest recipient of the award](#), behind **Sidney Crosby** and **John Tavares** (who both did so at age 16).

\* Finished the 2024-25 season with 41-88—129 in 56 GP and riding a 40-game point streak. He later extended that streak to 54 games during the 2025 WHL Playoffs, establishing a modern CHL record (since 2000) for the longest single-season point streak across the regular season, playoffs and Memorial Cup.

\* Led the WHL in assists (88) and plus-minus (plus-60) during the 2024-25 season.

\* His 2024-25 trophy case included CHL and WHL Player of the Year. He was also named to the CHL, WHL and Memorial Cup First All-Star Teams.

\* Helped the Medicine Hat win the 2025 WHL Championship and finished the playoffs third in the league and first on his team in points (9-29—38 in 16 GP).

\* In 2023-24, McKenna was named CHL and WHL Rookie of the Year after posting 34-63—97 in 61 GP.

\* On the international stage, McKenna has represented Canada at the 2026 World Junior Championship, where he finished the tournament second in scoring (4-10—14 in 7 GP) while helping his country earn bronze and at the 2025 World Junior Championship (1-0—1 in 5 GP).

\* He also represented Team Canada at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup (3-3—6 in 6 GP) and 2024 Under-18 World Championship, where he led the tournament in goals (10) and scored a hat trick in the championship game to help Canada rally for the gold-medal victory over Team USA.

\* Wore a vest [honoring his indigenous heritage](#), which was made by his grandmother, to all of Canada's games at the 2025 World Juniors. He became the first Indigenous *player from the Yukon* to represent Canada at the World Juniors.

\* A native of Whitehorse in Canada's Yukon Territory. Only six players out of the Yukon have been selected in the NHL Draft and/or appeared in an NHL game: **Max Graham** (No. 139 in 2024 by NJD;

currently in PIT organization), **Dylan Cozens** (No. 7 in 2019 by BUF; currently plays for OTT), **Gerard Dicaire** (No. 162 in 2002 by TBL; did not play in NHL); did not play in NHL), **Peter Sturgeon** (No. 36 in 1974 by BOS; 6 GP in NHL) and **Bryon Baltimore** (undrafted; 2 GP in NHL).

\* Grew up playing on an outdoor rink in his backyard built by his father, **Willy**. McKenna spent at least an hour a day, almost every day, out on that ice in temperatures at times as low as -20 to -30 Celsius (-4 to -20 Fahrenheit).

\* Was a big Blackhawks fan growing up and lists **Patrick Kane** among his favorite players. He watched Kane highlights on YouTube daily as a kid.

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

Shows exceptional poise and maturity in his game, demonstrating a high hockey IQ that allows him to dictate play. His skating stride is fluid and efficient, giving him the ability to separate in transition and maintain speed through tight areas. He consistently makes smart reads, showing strong puck distribution instincts and the confidence to hold onto the puck under pressure. Projects as a player with pro-level pace and vision, someone who can drive a line and elevate those around him.

## **CHASE REID**

**Defense | Sault Ste. Marie (OHL)**

**Born: Pontiac, Mich.**

**No. 2-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Finished second across the OHL in points-per-game among defensemen (tied; 1.07) after recording 18-30—48 in 2025-26. Reid missed the remaining 17 games of the regular season due to injury but contributed 3-3—6 through 10 postseason appearances.

\* Was named the CHL Top Draft Prospect for 2025-26 – the eighth defenseman to claim the award since its inception in 1990-91.

\* Topped all rookies in assists and rookie defensemen in points across the OHL in 2024-25 after posting 7-33—40 in 39 GP.

\* Represented Team USA at the 2026 World Junior Championship, his first time representing his country at a major international tournament (2-2—4 in 5 GP).

\* Was initially a forward but switched to defense when he reached the Detroit Honeybaked AAA program.

\* His mother, **Magyn**, was a competitive dancer who now teaches dance up to five days a week.

## **SCOUTING REPORT**

A take-charge type of defenseman that dictates the game. He plays a ton of minutes in all situations. A smooth skater with good edges and an effortless glide. He displays elite hockey sense and composure, with the ability to read and execute plays anywhere on the ice. He can jump up to lead the rush, knows when to pick his spots and has excellent recovery when transitioning from offense to defense. He is not afraid to mix it up and play physical and finish checks. No holes in his game, the complete package.

## **CARSON CARELS**

**Defense | Prince George (WHL)**

**Born: Brandon, Man.**

**No. 3-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Recorded 20-53—73 (58 GP) for the second-highest point total in a single season by a defenseman in Prince George Cougars history. Carels finished tied for fourth in scoring among all blueliners across the WHL, a campaign highlighted by a 17-game point streak, tied for the fourth-longest run by any player in the WHL in 2025-26. He also recorded 1-9—10 in 10 games during the WHL playoffs.

\* Named captain of Team West for the 2026 WHL Prospects Game, where he tallied four assists.

\* Recorded 6-29—35 (60 GP) in 2024-25 to finish fifth in scoring among rookie defensemen across the WHL.

\* Became the fifth-youngest defenseman to play for Team Canada at the 2026 World Junior Championship, trailing **Jay Bouwmeester** (2000, 2001), **Chris Joseph** (1987), **Matthew Schaefer** (2025) and **Scott Niedermayer** (1991). He earned a bronze medal at the tournament (0-1—1 in 5 GP).

\* Won gold at the 2025 Under-18 World Championship, silver at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge with Team Canada Red and bronze at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup.

\* Works on his family farm in Cypress River, Man., which has over 500 cows. Carels also grew up raising goats.

## **SCOUTING REPORT**

A unique, all-round defenseman who has offensive talent and brings a physical element while playing sound defensively. Can play big minutes and is deployed in all situations with the ability to run a power play. An excellent puck transporter and distributor who drives offense and shows some elite offensive skill. Skates very well with excellent mobility and agility and can defend with speed. Plays with his on a swivel in the defensive zone and is good at taking away passing and shooting lanes. A potential top pair defenseman.

## **KEATON VERHOEFF**

**Defense | Univ. of North Dakota (NCAA)**

**Born: Fort Saskatchewan, Alta.**

**No. 4-Ranked North American Skater**

\* A 6' 3.5" freshman with the Univ. of North Dakota, Verhoeff led all draft-eligible defensemen in the NCAA this season with 6-14—20 (36 GP). He helped North Dakota make it to the NCAA Frozen Four Semifinal.

\* Played for the WHL's Victoria Royals in 2024-25 and finished the season with the most goals and the third-most points among rookie defensemen across the league after posting 21-24—45 (63 GP).

\* A four-time medalist on the international stage, Verhoeff helped Canada win gold at the 2025 Under-18 World Championship and 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. He also has bronze medals from the 2026 World Junior Championship and 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, where he captained his country. He also wore the 'C' in Canada's entry at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship.

\* Verhoeff was coached by Hockey Hall of Fame forward **Jarome Iginla** at RINK Hockey Academy in Kelowna and billeted with the Iginla family during that time.

\* His cousins are current Canadiens forward **Kirby Dach** (3rd overall in 2019 by CHI) and Oilers forward **Colton Dach** (62nd overall in 2021 by CHI) – he calls the two of them his inspiration and his role models. Verhoeff skates and trains with them in the summers.

\* Verhoeff started as a goaltender before moving to defense – he played his last game in net at age 11.

## **SCOUTING REPORT**

Elite defenseman who finished his first NCAA season at North Dakota. Combination of size and skill has him in the conversation for the top prospect in the 2026 NHL Draft. Displays an ability to make all of the necessary plays to get the puck out of his defensive zone whether making a quick first pass or transporting the puck up ice on a rush. Has an innate ability to make the right play at the right time whether a big hit or a shot that challenges the opposing goaltender. Type of defenseman that can play big minutes and get stronger as the game goes on. Can impact the game from his position like few in this draft class. Very complete player.

## **DAXON RUDOLPH**

**Defense | Prince Albert (WHL)**

**Born: Lacombe, Alta.**

**No. 5-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Finished third in scoring among defensemen across the WHL after tallying 28-50—78 (68 GP). His point total was boosted by a 13-game point streak where he amassed 11-13—24, including a run of six straight multi-point games. As a blueliner, Rudolph concluded the postseason tied for first in points across the league with 9-18—27 (19 GP).

\* Finished fourth in points among WHL rookie defensemen in 2024-25 after tallying 7-34—41 (64 GP). Rudolph averaged over a point per game during the playoffs to finish with the most assists by a WHL rookie blueliner (11) and the second-most points (12).

\* Has three medals while representing Team Canada on the international stage, including gold at the 2025 Under-18 World Championship and 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. He also has a bronze from the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, where he tallied 2-2—4 (5 GP) and wore an 'A'.

## **SCOUTING REPORT**

A top defender used in all situations who logs big minutes. A strong and agile skater who plays a heads up, intelligent game. Ability to control the game, showing poise beyond his years. An excellent QB on the power play who generates scoring chances and quality shots from the point. He brings a calm and confident game under pressure with the ability to evade forecheckers. He makes plays in all three zones and can transport the puck with a commanding presence every shift while impacting both ends of the ice. Strong defensive positioning, ability to break up plays - a complete two-way NHL prospect who plays a take-charge game.

## **CALEB MALHOTRA**

**Center | Brantford (OHL)**

**Born: Victoria, B.C.**

**No. 6-Ranked North American Skater**

\* As a rookie, Malhotra finished second across the OHL in assists (55) and second in points among rookies after posting 29-55—84 (67 GP). His season has been highlighted by a five- and four-point performance as well as 24 multi-point games.

\* Malhotra tallied 13-13—26 (15 GP) to top all rookies in playoff scoring – 18 points above the next-closest players – and finished fourth in goals and fifth in points among all OHL players in the playoffs. His postseason performance included five multi-goal games as well as a four- and five-point outing.

\* Currently tops all rookies in playoff scoring with a 1.86 points-per-game average (8-5—13 in 7 GP).

\* Skated in the BCHL with the Chilliwack Chiefs in 2024-25 where he posted 8-18—26 (44 GP), the most points by a rookie on his team that season.

\* His father, **Manny**, was head coach of the AHL's Abbotsford Canucks during the 2025-26 season and was a longtime NHL forward who skated in 991 career games with the Rangers, Stars, Blue Jackets, Sharks, Canucks, Hurricanes and Canadiens from 1998-99 to 2014-15.

\* His sports roots run deep. His mom, **Joann**, was a soccer star at the Univ. of Victoria, while his uncle is two-time NBA MVP **Steve Nash**.

## **SCOUTING REPORT**

A first-year center selected 8th overall in the 2024 OHL Draft. He made his mark right away on a deep Brantford team producing very good offensive numbers. He has a good combination of size, skating ability, and does everything well with and without the puck. He has excellent hockey sense, plays a responsible 200-foot game, and knows how to create and finish offensively. The type of player you want on the ice in any situation and plays the pro-style game with high end skills, work habits and compete.

## **TYNAN LAWRENCE**

**Center | Boston University (NCAA)**

**Born: Fredericton, N.B.**

**No. 7-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Missed the majority of 2025-26 with a knee injury but recorded 2-5—7 in 18 GP with Boston Univ. He is one of just five players to be age 17 the entirety of the NCAA season.

\* Finished second in rookie goals and third in scoring across the USHL in 2024-25 after posting 25-29—54 (56 GP) – a point total benefitted by an 11-game point streak and a four-point game.

\* Lawrence led the USHL in playoff scoring, posting 8-10—18 (14 GP) to help Muskegon win the 2025 USHL Clark Cup Championship. He earned Clark Cup MVP honors.

\* Won gold with Team Canada White at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (3-3—6 in 5 GP) and bronze at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup (1-2—3 in 5 GP). He also was part of Canada's entry at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship (2-4—6 in 5 GP), where he finished tied for second in team scoring.

\* His brother, **Josh**, was a 2022 Memorial Cup champion with the QMJHL's Saint John Sea Dogs and split the 2025-26 season playing overseas in Slovakia and Russia.

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

A very smart and skilled center that can drive offense for himself and his teammates. Plays a two-way game and has an all-around set of tools that make him a very prized prospect.

## **NIKITA KLEPOV**

**Right Wing | Saginaw (OHL)**

**Born: Deerfield Beach, Fla.**

**No. 8-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Tallied 37-60—97 (67 GP) to top the league in scoring as a rookie and earn the OHL's Rookie of the Year award. The 17-year-old became the third player in OHL history to win both rookie of the year and the OHL's top scorer in the same season, joining **Patrick Kane** (2006-07) and **Jack Valiquette** (1973-74).

\* Set a Saginaw Spirit record for most assists and points in a season by a rookie, besting **Cole Perfetti** (37 A & 74 P in 2018-19).

\* Spent the majority of the 2024-25 season with the USHL's Sioux City Musketeers, where he collected 12-19—31 (59 GP) and scored three game-winning goals before he notched 1-1—2 in five playoff games. Only two rookies since 2002-03 have finished a regular season with more game-winning goals for the Musketeers than Klepov: **Robert Carpenter** (6 in 2014-15) and **Dylan James** (5 in 2021-22).

\* Represented Team USA at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, where he finished with the championship-clinching goal after the country rallied from a Preliminary Round defeat against Sweden to capture a gold medal at the tournament for the first time in 22 years.

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

Plays a high energy, offensive game. Always dangerous every time he has the puck and is the "go to" shooter on the power play - one of the best one-timers in this Draft class. He gets involved all over the ice, plays physical and in the trenches. He has a high hockey IQ with his elite puck skills and knows how to find the back of the net.

## **ETHAN BELCHETZ**

**Left Wing | Windsor (OHL)**

**Born: Oakville, Ont.**

**No. 9-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Averaged over a point per game with the Windsor Spitfires tallying 34-25—59 (57 GP) to help his team finish second in the Western Conference and tie their third-highest win total in a single season in franchise history.

\* Finished 10th in rookie scoring across the OHL in 2024-25 after posting 17-21—38 in 56 GP. His season was highlighted by a four-goal and six-point outing – that night he became the first Spitfires 16-year-old rookie to score four goals in a game since **Taylor Hall** on Mar. 6, 2008.

\* Named to the 2024-25 OHL Second All-Rookie Team.

\* Selected first overall in the 2024 OHL Priority Selection by the Windsor Spitfires.

\* Won gold with Team Canada White at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge, where he averaged a point per game (4-1—5 in 5 GP), as well as a bronze at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, where he finished tied for fifth in tournament scoring (4-3—7 in 5 GP).

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

A combination of size, strength and skill who projects as a power forward. He's made noticeable improvements to his footwork, agility and overall quickness. He is a player that is tough to handle down low and is a beast in front of the net. He has really good offensive hockey sense and can think the game with smart players. Good anticipation, good hands and a good shot to generate chances. Two-way game combined with work ethic gives him a very high ceiling.

## **ILIA MOROZOV**

**Center | Miami (NCAA)**

**Born: Moscow, Russia**

**No. 10-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Tallied 8-12—20 in 36 GP with Miami Univ. and finished tied for second in points among players 17 or younger in the NCAA this season.

\* One of the youngest players in the NCAA and just one of five 17-year-olds. He graduated from high school early after returning home to Russia in the summer to take one last course prior to joining Miami Univ.

\* Topped USHL's Tri-City Storm in rookie scoring in 2024-25 after posting 11-11—22 (59 GP).

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

A highly intelligent two-way forward who brings pace and precision to his game. He shows excellent awareness off the puck, supporting plays responsibly while positioning himself to create scoring opportunities in transition. His combination of strong edges, quick hands and a deceptive release makes him a consistent offensive threat, particularly on entries and in tight spaces. His compete level, versatility, and ability to elevate the play of those around him project well for success at the pro level.

## **OSCAR HEMMING**

**Left Wing | Boston College (NCAA)**

**Born: Vaasa, Finland**

**No. 11-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Was one of just five 17-year-olds to skate in the NCAA this season, where he tallied 1-7—8 (19 GP) for the fourth-most points among that cohort.

\* In 2024-25, Hemming spent the majority of the season skating in Finland's top under-18 league, ranking second in goals and tied for the most points after posting 35-28—63 (31 GP). He also spent 18 GP skating with Kiekko-Espoo's junior team (2-8—10) and helped them win a silver medal in the playoffs (3-6—9 in 13 GP).

\* Represented Finland at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, where he led his country in scoring after posting 4-2—6 (5 GP).

\* His brother **Emil**, was a first-round pick by the Stars in 2024 (29th overall) who played for the OHL's Barrie Colts and AHL's Texas Stars in 2025-26. His father, **Jonas Hemming**, also had a long hockey career overseas, predominantly playing in their native country of Finland.

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

Missed the first half of season and joined Boston College for remainder of 2025-26 campaign. A solid size/strength forward with smarts and skills who will fit into the NHL Power Forward category. Effective physical presence utilizing his size and strength down low, finishes hits and has a very good puck protection game. Strong stride skater who moves well for his size and will only get quicker and faster as he continues to physically mature. Good hockey smarts with vision, reading plays and making good choices to generate chances. Good skill set handling and moving the puck, good passer and shooter. Has all the skills, attributes and projection to be a difference maker.

## **JP HURLBERT**

**Left Wing | Kamloops (WHL)**

**Born: Allen, Texas**

**No. 12-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Topped all rookies across the WHL in goals and points in 2025-26 after amassing 42-55—97 (68 GP). He also finished fourth in scoring across the league in both goals (tied) and points.

\* Won 2025-26 WHL Rookie of the Year after being named WHL Player of the Month in both September and October, He was also nominated for CHL Rookie of the Year Award.

\* Tallied 19-18—37 (56 GP) with USA Hockey's National Team Development Program Under-17 in 2024-25, where he finished third on his team in scoring and tied for second in goals.

\* Played for Team USA in the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (0-3—3 in 5 GP).

\* Born in Allen, Texas and grew up playing hockey in the Dallas Stars Elite program. He spent two seasons skating with **Blake Fiddler**, who was selected in the second round of the 2025 NHL Draft.

## **SCOUTING REPORT**

A first year WHL player after joining from USA Hockey's NTDP. Had an excellent start in his WHL career, scoring at a very high pace and leading the league early on. He maintained his scoring pace throughout the season. Used as the top line center in Kamloops and is a key contributor on both the penalty kill and the power play. An elite offensive player with good awareness who does everything quick with high tempo. Has the ability to find open space and will get behind defenders to create odd man rushes. A good shot with a quick release and can score on the one timer. A very good touch around the net, competes with the ability to come up with loose pucks and generate chances.

## **WYATT CULLEN**

**Left Wing | USA U-18 (NTDP)**

**Born: Moorhead, Min.**

**No. 13-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Recorded 16-29—45 (40 GP) in 2025-26 with USA Hockey's National Team Development Program Under-18 Team, finishing the campaign tied for fourth on his team in assists and sixth in points.

\* Topped USA Hockey's NTDP Under-17 Team in assists (tied) after collecting 6-25—31 (55 GP) in 2024-25.

\* Represented his country at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge and at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship where he led his country in scoring after posting 3-6—9 (5 GP).

\* His father, **Matt**, is a three-time Stanley Cup champion (2006, 2016 & 2017) who skated in 1,516 career NHL games – the [most ever by a U.S.-born forward](#). He spent his career between the Ducks, Panthers, Hurricanes, Rangers, Senators, Wild, Predators and Penguins from 1997-98 to 2018-19. His uncle, **Mark**, also skated in 38 NHL games with the Blackhawks, Flyers and Panthers from 2005-06 to 2011-12.

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

A high IQ player who reads the game very well, makes quick, smart decisions under pressure and consistently positions himself effectively in all three zones. An excellent skater with good balance and agility, plays with poise in tight areas. Makes high-percentage plays that drive possession and create scoring chances. His competitiveness, work ethic, and commitment to two-way play stand out shift in and shift out.

## **ADAM NOVOTNY**

**Left Wing | Peterborough (OHL)**

**Born: Hradec Kralove, Czechia**

**No. 14-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Collected 34-31—65 (58 GP) in his first OHL season with the Peterborough Petes and finished with the second-most goals (tied) and fourth-most points among draft-eligible skaters.

\* Novotny played in Czechia's top professional league in 2024-25, where he tallied 1-2—3 (41 GP). He was one of six players age 17 or younger to collect a point that season and finished second in scoring among that cohort behind **Vojtech Cihar**, who was the Kings' second-round pick in the 2025 NHL Draft.

\* Made his professional hockey debut in 2023-24 with Mountfield HK and at 15, became the youngest player to score in Czechia's top level.

\* Represented his country five times on the international stage, earning silver medals at the 2026 World Junior Championship and 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, as well as bronze at the 2025 World Junior Championship. He also appeared in the 2025 Under-18 World Championship (2-4—6 in 5 GP), finishing second on team in scoring, and at the 2023 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

First-year OHL player from Czechia. An excellent skater with footwork and agility to go with good size. He displays excellent hockey sense and offensive instincts and skills. He has fast hands and good moves with the ability to fight through traffic and execute plays. Plays with an edge and competes with his smarts and skills. Good playmaker setting up teammates and has a quick release shot. A top line forward who plays a big role in Peterborough and has all the elements of a good pro prospect.

## **MADDOX DAGENAIS**

**Center | Quebec (QMJHL)**

**Born: Blanville, Que.**

**No. 15-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Averaged a point per game in 2025-26 (30-32—62 in 62 GP) to finish second on his team in scoring and mark a 36-point improvement over his rookie season. He also earned the 2025-26 QMJHL Best Professional Prospect (Mike Bossy Trophy).

\* Posted 12-14—26 (43 GP) during his rookie season in 2024-25 and helped the club rebound from its only playoff absence in franchise history (2023-24). His season began with three consecutive multi-point games and featured six goals and nine points through his first five contests – tied for the second and third most in franchise history, respectively.

\* Played for Team Canada Red in their silver medal performance at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge – his one assist came as the primary helper on the game-winning goal against the United States in the semifinal. Dagenais also represented his country at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship.

\* His father, **Pierre**, was a fourth-round pick by the Devils in the 1998 NHL Draft (105th overall) who appeared in 142 career games with the Devils, Panthers and home province Canadiens from 2000-01 to 2005-06.

\* Upon Maddox's first-overall selection in the 2024 QMJHL Draft, the family became the first father-son duo in League history to each be selected with the No. 1 pick (Pierre: 1995 w/ Moncton).

## **SCOUTING REPORT**

Just completed his second season after being selected 1st overall by the Quebec Remparts in the 2024 QMJHL Draft. A combination of size, skill and natural offensive instincts. Maddox is an offensive threat playing on the top line with the Quebec Remparts, including on the power play. He has high end puck skills and an ability to make plays in tight areas. Has an excellent shot release and is a threat from all angles. His skating is continuing to improve as he adds strength and develops. He is utilized on the wing but has had success as a center. He has added a physical layer to his game finishing checks a lot more regularly. The combination of size and goal scoring abilities make him an intriguing NHL prospect.

## **RYAN LIN**

**Defense | Vancouver (WHL)**

**Born: Richmond, B.C.**

**No. 16-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Collected 14-43—57 (53 GP) in 2025-26 to finish tied for 11th across the WHL in assists and points among defensemen.

\* Named the Giants' 24th captain in franchise history on Jan. 9, 2026, saying "It feels surreal to be named the next captain of the Vancouver Giants – this is the team I grew up watching and cheering on as a kid."

\* Tallied 5-48—53 (60 GP) in 2024-25 to top all rookies in assists across the WHL and finished fifth in points in that category.

\* Won gold at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge and 2025 Under-18 World Championship, as well as bronze at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup where he averaged a point per game (2-3—5 in 5 GP). Lin also represented his country at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship (1-5—6 in 5 GP) and finished tied atop the tournament in points by defensemen.

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

A very high IQ defender and a scoring threat from the point, who sets up teammates to produce big offensive numbers. He thinks the game at an elite level on both sides of the puck. **No. 17-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Tallied 13-68—81 (63 GP) in 2025-26 with the Moncton Wildcats to top all players in the QMJHL in assists while being a rookie defenseman. He also finished with the most points among rookie defensemen across the league and with the assists by a defenseman in a single season in franchise history.

\* Has averaged 1.33 points per game through the 2026 QMJHL playoffs to finish atop the league in assists and third in points (6-22—28 in 21 GP) after his team's run to the finals.

\* Won CHL Rookie of the Year Award after he set a new QMJHL record for points by a rookie defenseman, while his 68 assists are highest single-season total by a CHL rookie defenseman in the 21st century. Bleyl was also named 2025-26 QMJHL Defenseman of the Year and QMJHL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

His overall skating could be in the top of his draft class. He has a smooth, effortless stride and generates speed that he uses to his advantage. He's also very mobile with his back stride making him hard to beat 1v1. He runs the first power play unit of a strong Moncton squad. He excels in all situations of the game, impacts the game as a power play quarterback but also as an ultra-efficient puck mover from the back end. His vision, puck skill and poise are impressive. He defends well and is amongst the best plus-minus players in the entire league. Produces offense with a mature style, excellent risk and reward choices. **Born: Laval, Que.**

**No. 18-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Collected 6-32—38 (37 GP) this past season in a campaign shortened due to injury. He finished with the third-highest points-per-game rate among all QMJHL defensemen and the fourth-highest point total (tied) among blueliners in the playoffs (6-8—14 in 17 GP).

\* Won 2024-25 QMJHL Defenseman of the Year after topping all blueliners in assists, tallying 12-50—62 in 61 GP. He also set a Blainville-Boisbriand franchise record for most assists in a single campaign by a defenseman.

\* During his rookie season in 2023-24, Villeneuve topped all QMJHL rookie defensemen in scoring (8-35—43 in 54 GP).

Good understanding of positioning to defend effectively, takes smart routes and angles and makes clever choices managing risks. His overall game continues to keep getting better and he projects as an offensive defenseman at the next level.

**No. 19-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Recorded 32-50—82 (63 GP) during his rookie season in the QMJHL, concluding 2025-26 seventh in scoring across the league and tops among all rookies in points.

\* Won 2025-26 QMJHL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

\* In 2024-25, Shilov collected 11-17—28 (39 GP) in the USHL for a Green Bay Gamblers club that captured a berth into the 2024-25 Clark Cup Playoffs. His 0.72 points per game were the fourth highest by a Gamblers rookie since 2012-13, topped by current Bruins forward **Casey Mittelstadt** (1.25 in 2016-17), and his 11 goals were the most by a Green Bay rookie since current Blackhawks rookie and No. 2 pick in the 2024 NHL Draft, **Artyom Levshunov** (13 in 2022-23).

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

Impactful, offensive player with a lot of creativity. Excellent puck skills mixed in with a great IQ and vision to execute at a high level. \* Finished second in scoring in the WHL this past season after recording 45-59—104 (68 GP), behind his twin brother, **Markus**. Ruck also tied for second in goals and fifth in assists – his season was highlighted by a nine-game goal streak, which was the longest across the league in 2025-26.

\* Led all WHL rookies in goals in 2024-25 after tallying 25-16—41 in 61 GP with the Medicine Hat Tigers. He was selected by the club ninth overall in the 2023 WHL Prospects Draft.

**No. 21-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Recorded 15-27—42 (46 GP) during the 2025-26 season and finished with the sixth-highest point-per-game average among players age 17 or younger across the OHL (min. 2 GP). His totals marked a 19-point improvement over his rookie season despite playing in 20 less games.

\* Amassed 11-12—23 (66 GP) as a rookie in 2024-25 to top the Generals in points by rookies. He also tallied 3-3—6 in 19 playoff games en route to the OHL Finals – tied for the most postseason points among rookies across the league.

\* Won gold for Team USA at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup (1-2—3 in 5 GP) and represented his country at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship.

\* Prior to being selected 38th overall by the Oshawa Generals, Rogowski was playing high school hockey in Detroit.

\* Won the 2025-26 CHL Top Scorer Award after his 108 points led not only the WHL this past season but the entire Canadian Hockey League.

\* Posted 8-21—29 (62 GP) during the 2024-25 season en route to a WHL championship. He was teammates with **Gavin McKenna**, the No. 1-ranked North American prospect.

\* Won a gold medal with Team Canada White at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (2-2—4 in 5 GP) and earned a bronze at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup (0-4—4 in 5 GP).

## **CASEY MUTRYN**

**Right Wing | USA U-18 (NTDP)**

**Born: Norwell, Mass.**

**No. 24-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Finished 2025-26 with 18-28—46 (62 GP) – fifth in scoring on USA Hockey’s National Team Development Program Under-18 Team. In December, he was named team captain.

\* In 2024-25, he split time between the USA Hockey’s NTDP Under-17 and Under-18 teams, recording 16-16—32 in 46 GP with the former and 3-2—5 in 20 GP with the latter. His point totals with the U-17 team ranked him fifth among all NTDP skaters.

\* Earned bronze at the 2025 Under-18 World Championship as the youngest player on his team. Mutryn also represented his country at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship, where he captained the team, and the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge, tied for third in tournament points with 3-5—8 in 5 GP.

\* Spent the majority of the 2024-25 season in the OJHL with the Milton Menace, averaging over a point per game (24-30—54 in 51 GP). He finished third across the OJHL in goals by rookies and fifth in scoring. Cali posted 6-7—13 (20 GP) en route to the OJHL final.

\* Was part of Canada's entry at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship and skated for Team Canada East in the 2024 World Junior A Challenge (0-2—2 in 5 GP).

\* Cali was born in Switzerland, where his mother, **Fiona McLeod**, played professional hockey for the Lugano Women's team in the Swiss professional women's league after three years at St. Cloud State University. \* Recorded 19-31—50 (68 GP) in 2024-25 and added 6-8—14 (20 GP) in the playoffs en route to an appearance in the championship series.

\* Skated for Team Canada Red at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge, where he posted 3-0—3 (7 GP).

\* Works construction in the summer with his father, **Daryl**, who is a carpenter.

He then joined the Ontario Hockey League, where he tallied 14-21—35 (31 GP) for the fourth-highest points-per-game average among draft-eligible skaters.

\* Spent the majority of 2024-25 skating in Slovakia's junior league, amassing 28-23—51 (32 GP) and finishing with the third-highest points per game (min. 10 GP). Nemeč also finished fifth in goals and points (tied). He also skated in 20 contests in the country's top men's league, finishing tied for the third-most points among skaters 17 or younger (3-4—7 in 20 GP).

\* Represented his country four times on the international stage: 2026 World Junior Championship (1-4—5 in 5 GP), 2025 and 2024 Under-18 World Championship, as well as at the 2024 Hlinka Gretzky Cup.

\* His brother, **Simon**, was a first-round pick by the Devils in the 2022 NHL Draft (2nd overall) and just completed his third season with New Jersey setting career highs for goals (11) and points (26). Simon is the highest-drafted Slovak born defenseman in NHL history, and was selected one pick after fellow countryman, **Juraj Slafkovsky**, became the first Slovak-born player to be selected first overall.

## **SCOUTING REPORT**

A good-sized winger who has earned steady minutes with a strong work rate and responsible two-way play. Offensively, he shows good zone awareness, gets into dangerous shooting areas and is more naturally a finisher than a pure playmaker. His skating has improved, giving him a strong stride that helps him pressure opponents, recover pucks, and be the first forward back defensively. He plays at an extremely high pace, which fuels his forechecking and energy. Along the boards he shows flashes of puck protection and small-area skill. Overall, he is a high-motor prospect who competes hard.

## **RYAN ROOBROECK**

**Left Wing | Niagara (OHL)**

**Born: London, Ont.**

**No. 28-Ranked North American Skater**

\* Recorded 30-28—58 (49 GP) to finish second on his team in scoring despite missing the final 19 games of the season due to injury. His 1.18 points per game average was the third highest among draft-eligible skaters.

\* Finished 2024-25 as the Niagara IceDogs top scorer after tallying 41-46—87 in 64 GP. Roobroeck finished the campaign ranked sixth (tied) for goals across the OHL and 13th in points.

\* During his rookie season in 2023-24, he finished second in goals among rookies (28), fourth in points (51) and tied for fifth in assists (23).

\* Won gold at the 2025 Under-18 World Championship, where he recorded 4-5—9 in 7 GP and scored in the semifinals. He also represented Team Canada Red at the 2023 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge (3-1—4 in 7 GP).

\* Amassed 20-32—52 (67 GP) to conclude the season fourth in rookie assists and points across the OHL. Cover was named OHL Rookie of the Week in his fourth week after producing five points through his first 7 GP of 2025-26.

\* Spent the majority of the 2024-25 season with St. Andrew's College (21-19—40 in 55 GP) and won the Prep Hockey Conference (PHC) Championship, the top tournament for North American prep schools.

\* Made his OHL debut in 2024-25, appearing in three games with the London Knights and collecting two assists.

\* Was born in Florida but only lived there a month before moving to the Grand Cayman Islands where he spent his childhood. He began his ice hockey journey on roller skates, started attending skating camps at age 10 in Toronto, did not go to his first ice hockey tryout until he was 13 and did not play competitively until he was 14.

\* Cover continues to play roller hockey – he competed in the North American Roller Hockey Championships (NARCh) in the professional division last summer.

\* Skated to a 17-point improvement over his rookie season and finished third on his team in game-winning goals (4). Berzkalns is currently fifth in playoff scoring across the USHL (tied; 4-6—10 in 12 GP).

\* Played 43 games for the Muskegon Lumberjacks in 2024-25, where he scored five goals and collected three assists.

\* Represented his Team Latvia at both the 2025 and 2026 World Junior Championship, where he scored against Canada with under two minutes in regulation to force overtime.

\* Committed to Boston College for 2026-27.

Player who does it all on the ice. Can play all three forward positions while contributing on both special teams. Takes important face-offs while being very responsible defensively. \* Concluded the 2025-26 season atop rookie defensemen across the OHL in goals and sixth in rookie scoring (tied) after posting 14-21—35 (59 GP).

\* In 2024-25, Vanecek split the season between Bili Tygri Liberec's under-17 team and their junior team. He finished the campaign with the sixth-most points by a 16-year-old defenseman in Czechia's junior league (0-4—4 in 31 GP).

\* Earned bronze at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship, where he finished with the most goals among defensemen across the tournament after tallying 3-2—5 (7 GP), and was part of the Team Czechia's silver-medal winning roster for the 2026 World Junior Championship but did not dress for any games – he was the youngest player on his team.

### IVAR STENBERG

Left Wing | Frolunda (SWEDEN)

Born: Gothenburg, Sweden

No. 1-Ranked International Skater

\* Leads all teenagers in Sweden's top professional hockey league in scoring with 11-22—33 in 43 GP – he finished the campaign five-points ahead of **Anton Frondell** (No. 3 overall by CHI in 2025). Stenberg finished 2025-26 with the most assists and points by an SHL junior and helped his club win the Champions Hockey League championship.

\* Stenberg concluded 2025-26 with the fifth-highest single-season point total ever by a player age 18 or younger in the SHL behind **Daniel Sedin, Markus Naslund, Tomas Sandstrom** and **Henrik Sedin**. Stenberg's 22 assists matched Henrik for the highest single-season total in SHL history by a player age 18 or younger.

\* In 2024-25, he spent half of the season with Frolunda's junior team where he topped Sweden's highest junior league in points per game (min. 3 GP) after operating at a 1.96 point-per-game pace and posting 26-27—53 (27 GP).

\* Made his professional hockey debut in 2024-25, playing in 25 SHL games (1-2—3) and finishing tied for the third-most points by a teenager in the playoffs (3-3—6 in 12 GP).

\* Won gold with Team Sweden at the 2026 World Junior Championship where he tied the fifth-most points in the tournament and the team lead (4-6—10 in 7 GP). Offensively, he displays elite hockey IQ and patience with the puck, often distributing with precision on the power play and in tight spaces. His vision and timing enable him to open up lanes and create high-quality scoring chances, as demonstrated by his multi-assist performances at both club and national levels. Also contributes defensively, maintaining clever positioning and showing a mature awareness uncommon for his age. Though still physically developing, his compete level and confidence make him effective in board battles and transition play.

## **ALBERTS SMITS**

**Defense | Munchen (Germany)**

**Born: Valmiera, Latvia**

**No. 2-Ranked International Skater**

\* Skates for Jukurit in Finland's top professional league where he has produced 6-7—13 in 38 GP, the second-most points by a player age 18 or younger in Liiga this season (at any position). Smits finished third among teenage defensemen in scoring, behind two drafted skaters.

\* Smits started 2025-26 averaging two points per game in Finland's top junior league (6-4—10 in 5 GP) and finished the campaign by being loaned to Munchen in the Germany's top men's league, where he contributed 2-4—6 in 10 postseason appearances.

\* Played for Team Latvia at the Olympic Winter Games Milano Cortina 2026 (0-2—2 in 4 GP).

\* Finished tied for the third-highest point-per-game pace (1.00; 10-10—20 in 20 GP) among defensemen in Finland's Under-18 league in 2024-25. He also played 21 GP for Jukurit's junior team (4-5—9 in 21 GP) and made his professional debut (1-1—2 in 9 GP).

His hockey IQ is exceptional, as evidenced by his ability to read plays, make intelligent first passes, and position himself effectively in both zones. He plays a physical yet clean game, utilizing his size and reach to win battles and neutralize one-on-one attackers. Offensively, Smits is dangerous from the blue line, with a heavy, accurate one-timer and the instincts to quarterback the power play. His calmness under pressure and maturity on the puck make him look like a seasoned pro rather than a teenager.

**Center | Tappara (FINLAND)**  
**Born: Turku, Finland**  
**No. 3-Ranked International Skater**

\* Spent the majority of 2025-26 playing in Finland's top pro league with Tappara, where he concluded the campaign with the most points by a player age 17 or younger in Liiga with 2-9—11 (48 GP).

\* Spent the 2024-25 season in Finland's Under-18 league where he posted 11-31—42 (42 GP), won the league championship and was named Best Forward in the league.

\* Represented his country internationally four times: 2026 Under-18 World Championship, 2026 World Junior Championship, 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.

\* His father, **Harri**, played professional hockey in Europe for over a decade.

### **SCOUTING REPORT**

One of the most complete and mature 17-year-old centers seen in Finland's Liiga since Aleksander Barkov. He has already been trusted in key roles for powerhouse Tappara. His strong skating, balance, and physical strength make him highly effective in faceoffs, battles and defensive coverage. A natural two-way player, he combines reliability and intelligence, rarely making mistakes while consistently supporting both ends of the ice. Offensively, can create space for teammates with intelligent positioning and strong puck protection, often generating second chances or assists through simple but effective plays. Forechecking and work ethic stand out, and he plays with pro-level consistency and awareness.

**Center | Djurgarden (SWEDEN)**

**Born: Stockholm, Sweden**

**No. 4-Ranked International Skater**

\* After recording 1-4—5 in 4 GP with Djurgardens' junior team, Bjorck has been skating in the Swedish Hockey League where he led all players 17 or younger (6-9—15 in 42 GP) in scoring and finished with the seventh-most points by a teenager.

\* Set single-season records in Sweden's junior league in 2024-25 for assists and points after registering 27-47—74 (42 GP). He also helped Djurgarden's junior team win the league title, finishing second in postseason points with 4-11—15 (9 GP).

\* Made his professional hockey debut in 2024-25 and was the only 16-year-old in Sweden's second division to score that season (1-0—1 in 1 GP).

\* Won gold at the 2026 World Junior Championship and finished the tournament with the second-highest point total on his team (3-6—9 in 7 GP). Has strengthened his lower body, demonstrating improved balance and competitiveness in board battles. He contributes effectively on both special teams, managing the puck well on breakouts and serving as a deceptive playmaker on the power play. His energy, forechecking, and two-way commitment make him a valuable all-situations forward. With his blend of speed, skill, and evolving physical maturity, projects as an A-level prospect.

## **ELTON HERMANSSON**

**Right Wing | MODO (SWEDEN-2)**

**Born: Ornskoldsvik, Sweden**

**No. 5-Ranked International Skater**

\* After collecting 3-6—9 (13 GP) playing with MoDo's junior team, Hermansson made his pro debut and concluded 2025-26 with the most points by a 17-year-old in Sweden's second division (11-10—21 in 38 GP). He also finished fifth in scoring by teenagers.

\* Spent the majority of 2024-25 playing in Sweden's top junior league where he amassed 17-19—36 (41 GP). He finished with the third-most goals (17) and fourth-most points (36) among 16-year-olds across the league that season.

\* Won gold at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship, totaling 4-8—12 (7 GP) to finish with the most assists and points in the tournament, a performance that earned Best Forward honors. Projects as a player with first-round potential, blending flair, intelligence, and a high offensive ceiling that promises significant upside.

**No. 6-Ranked International Skater**

\* Spent the majority of 2025-26 playing professional hockey in Finland, where he skated in 29 GP and finished with the most points by an Under-18 defenseman (0-3—3). He also skated in 15 games with Tappara's junior team (1-12—13 in 15 GP).

\* In 2024-25, Piiparinen played for Tappara's junior team and tallied 2-14—16 (40 GP). He topped the league in assists and scoring (tied) by players age 16 or younger. He also helped their Under-18 team win the league's championship, collecting 3-9—12 (9 GP).

Offensively, he has started to show flashes of playmaking skill and composure with the puck, though his shot and offensive assertiveness are still developing. His maturity, consistency, and improving two-way presence make him an A-level prospect.

**Defense | HV71 (SWEDEN)**  
**Born: Vackelsang, Sweden**  
**No. 7-Ranked International Skater**

\* Tallied 4-8—12 (19 GP) playing in Sweden’s top junior league before making his professional hockey debut in the Swedish Hockey League. Gustafsson has the second-most points among 17-year-olds in the SHL, the only player with more is fellow draft-eligible prospect, **Viggo Bjorck**, who is a forward (0-3—3 in 27 GP).

\* Skated the majority of the 2024-25 season with HV71’s junior team, where he finished with the second-most points among defensemen age 17 or younger across the league (2-6—8 in 36 GP).

\* Won gold at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship, silver at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, where he averaged over a point per game (2-4—6 in 5 GP) as well as two bronze medals at the 2025 World Junior A Challenge and 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.

\* His brother, **Viggo**, was a third-round pick by the Predators in the 2024 NHL Draft (77th overall) who helped Team Sweden earn gold at the 2026 World Junior Championship and split the 2025-26 season between playing in Sweden and with the AHL’s Milwaukee Admirals.

**SCOUTING REPORT**

Shows remarkable composure and confidence beyond his age. He skates well, handles the puck cleanly, and doesn’t look nervous even in the SHL. His mobility and poise under pressure stand out, allowing him to contribute effectively in both zones. His decision-making generally reflects maturity and game awareness. Defensively, he is strong positionally, using an active stick and body to close space and win battles. He demonstrates control and calm when quarterbacking the power play, distributing crisp passes, and showing the ability to create offense from the blue line. His performance typically showcases his offensive upside, blending skill and vision with physical reliability. His skating agility and balance for a player of his size make him a modern two-way defenseman with legitimate top-pair potential.

**Left Wing | Djurgarden Jr. (SWEDEN-JR.)**

**Born: Stockholm, Sweden**

**No. 8-Ranked International Skater**

\* Spent the majority of 2025-26 in Sweden's top junior league, where he finished with the sixth-most points by under-18 players (14-24—38 in 25 GP). He also made his professional debut and was one of just three 17-year-olds with points in the SHL (0-1—1 in 8 GP).

\* In 2024-25, he split the season between Djurgarden's Under-18 team (22-24—46 in 27 GP) and their junior team (9-9—18 in 17 GP), helping both clubs with gold.

Overall, Nordmark projects as a top-line, two-way scoring forward and a legitimate A-prospect with first-round potential.

**GLEB PUGACHYOV****Right Wing | Nizhny Novgorod Jr. (RUSSIA-JR.)****Born: Almaty, Kazakhstan****No. 9-Ranked International Skater**

\* Collected 10-14—24 in 33 GP skating in Russia's top junior league. He also made his professional hockey debut, skating 13 GP in the KHL and finishing with the most points by a player age 17 or younger (2-1—3). He also played 15 GP in Russia's second-highest league and concluded the campaign with the second-most points among players of that age group (1-4—5 in 15 GP).

\* Spent the majority of 2024-25 in the MHL, where he collected 5-12—17 in 42 GP. He was the second-highest scoring 16-year-old on his team. In the postseason, Pugachyov finished second in the league in scoring among players age 16 or younger (5-6—11 in 14 GP).

\* Named to the 2025-26 MHL All-Star game.

He was also loaned to HC Thurgau, where he played 8 GP in the country's second division (7-4—11 in 8 GP) as well as 4 GP in their junior league (4-3—7 in 4 GP).

**Born: Stockholm, Sweden**  
**No. 11-Ranked International Skater**

\* Led Sweden's junior league in scoring among all draft-eligible players in 2025–26 with 17-27—44 in 30 GP.

\* Finished the 2024-25 season with a combined 30-26—56 (26 GP) between Sweden's two Under-18 leagues, including averaging nearly two points per game (16-17—33 in 17 GP) in the country's top junior league. Command had the second-most goals (tied) and points among those skaters.

\* Won gold at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship and bronze at the 2025 World Junior A Challenge, averaging a point per game at both tournaments.

\* Recorded 7-15—22 in 42 GP in 2024-25, the sixth-most points among defensemen age 17 or younger in Sweden's junior league. He was called up to Lulea's men's team and went on to capture the club's first SHL championship since 1996.

\* Helped Sweden win a gold medal at the 2026 World Junior Championship, where he tied for fourth in points by a draft-eligible defenseman (0-2—2 in 7 GP). He also won bronze at the 2024 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.

**Born: Trencin, Slovakia**  
**No. 14-Ranked International Skater**

\* Played in Slovakia's top professional men's league in 2025-26, where he tallied 4-7—11 in 43 GP for the most points by any skater age 17 or younger across the league.

\* In 2022-23, Goljer made his debut in Slovakia's junior league at age 14 – he is one of just three skaters to accomplish that feat in the past 10 seasons. The next year, he made his professional hockey debut at age 15 in the country's top men's league.

\* Earned a silver medal at the 2026 Under-18 World Championship and posted 2-3—5 in 7 GP for the tournament's Best Defenseman honors. He also represented Slovakia at the 2026 World Junior Championship, 2025 Under-18 World Championship and in the 2024 and 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, where he recorded the most points among defenseman on his team in both of those appearances.

He logs heavy minutes in all situations, though fatigue can show later in games, leading him to prioritize defensive responsibility over risk. With the puck, Adam remains calm, makes intelligent decisions, and consistently avoids panic under pressure.

\* Spent the majority of the 2025-26 season skating in Sweden's junior league and amassed 20-20—40 (29 GP), tied for the fifth-most goals across the league. He also made his professional hockey debut, skating in 16 games in the SHL.

**No. 29-Ranked International Skater**

\* In 2025-26, Elofsson recorded the most assists and points among all defensemen in Sweden's top junior league (9-32—41 in 32 GP) and earned Defensive Player of the Year honors. He has operated at a point-per-game pace during his two seasons in Sweden's top junior league.
