



The NHL's biggest stars will descend on 'The Entertainment Capital of the World' when the Golden Knights and the city of Las Vegas host the **2022 Honda NHL All-Star Weekend** from Feb. 4-6, 2022. The weekend will begin with the **2022 NHL All-Star Skills presented by DraftKings Sportsbook** on Friday, Feb. 4 (7:30 p.m. ET on ESPN, Sportsnet, TVA Sports) followed by the **2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game** on Saturday Feb. 5 (3 p.m. ET on ABC, Sportsnet TVA Sports).

\* Las Vegas will become the [31st different city](#) to host at least one NHL All-Star Game, while Nevada will become the 19th different U.S. state to welcome the event. The Golden Knights will be represented by captain **Mark Stone**, defenseman **Alex Pietrangelo** and head coach **Peter DeBoer** on the Pacific Division roster.

\* The city of Las Vegas is no stranger to holding NHL events including 10 NHL Awards ceremonies (most recently 2019 at Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino). Additionally, the Golden Knights unveiled the first players in franchise history at the [2017 Expansion Draft](#) (T-Mobile Arena) before their record-setting inaugural season that saw them advance all the way to the 2018 Stanley Cup Final, where T-Mobile Arena hosted Games 1, 2 and 5.

# BY THE NUMBERS

*Stats through games played Feb. 2, 2022; ages as of Feb. 5, 2022*

**1996** – The last year a defenseman was named MVP of an NHL All-Star Game, with **Ray Bourque** of the Bruins claiming the honor after scoring the go-ahead, game-winning goal at 19:22 of the third period in front of his home crowd at FleetCenter in Boston.

**411** – The highest combined point total so far this season by players representing one division at the 2022 NHL All-Star Game, with the Central leading the way (Pacific: 406; Atlantic: 377; Metropolitan: 319).

**184** – The highest combined goal total so far this season by players representing one division at the 2022 NHL All-Star Game, with the Pacific leading the way thanks to the addition of 20-goal scorer **Jonathan Marchessault** of the host Golden Knights (Central: 173; Atlantic: 139; Metropolitan: 137).

**47** – The highest combined win total so far this season by goaltenders representing one division at the 2022 NHL All-Star Game, with the Metropolitan leading the way (Atlantic: 46; Central: 42; Pacific: 32).

**37** – Age, in years, of Stars forward **Joe Pavelski** (Central), the oldest player on a roster for the 2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game. Pavelski (37 years, 209 days on Feb. 5, 2022) is set to become the oldest player to skate in an NHL All-Star Game since **Jaromir Jagr** in 2016 (43 years, 350 days).

**34** – Age, in years, of **Cam Talbot** (MIN) who is set to make his first career NHL All-Star Game appearance. He can become the sixth goaltender in League history to appear in the event for the first time at age 34 or older, following **Johnny Bower** (age 36 in 1961), **Manny Legace** (age 34 in 2008), **Mike Smith** (age 34 in 2017), **Dwayne Roloson** (age 34 in 2004) and **Rejean Lemelin** (age 34 in 1989).

**27.5** – Average age of the Atlantic and Central Divisions, the youngest of the four (Metropolitan: 27.6; Pacific: 28.4).

**23** – Career NHL All-Star Game appearances by **Gordie Howe**, the most by a player in League history. His final NHL All-Star Game was in 1980, when over 21,000 attendees [famously gave the 51-year-old a standing ovation at Joe Louis Arena](#).

**20** – Age, in years, of Devils forward **Jack Hughes** (Metropolitan), the youngest player on a roster for the 2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game. Hughes (20 years, 267 days) is set to become the youngest player to skate in an NHL All-Star Game since Quinn Hughes (20 years, 103 days) at the 2020 All-Star Game.

**16** – The number of U.S.-born players on 2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game rosters. To date, the most U.S.-born players to skate in an All-Star Game is 14, in 2019 at SAP Center in San Jose.

**13** – Career NHL All-Star Game appearances by **Glenn Hall**, the most by a goaltender in League history.

**10** – Seasons since the last NHL All-Star Game appearance for **Jordan Eberle** (2012), who is set to become the 11th player in League history to go at least that long from his first appearance to his next.

**10** – Number of individuals who have both played in and served as head coach in an NHL All-Star Game, with **Rod Brind'Amour** (1992 as player) set to join the list. To date, only six individuals have *done both in the NHL's expansion era* (since 1967-68; last appearance in parentheses): **Rick Tocchet** (2020), **Wayne Gretzky** (2017), **Randy Carlyle** (2007), **Jacques Lemaire** (1998), **Bob Gainey** (1992) and **Al Arbour** (1985).

**10** – Number of different players since 2003-04 to skate in an NHL All-Star Game at age 37 or older. At age 37 years, 209 days, Stars forward **Joe Pavelski** (Central) can become the 11th in that span to do so.

**8** – Number of birth countries represented on 2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game rosters: Canada (17), United States (16), Russia (3), Sweden (3), Finland (2), Switzerland (2), Denmark (1) and Germany (1).

**7** – Combined Stanley Cup wins by players representing the Atlantic Division at the 2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game, the most of any division (Metropolitan: 3; Pacific: 1; Central: 0).

**5** – Consecutive events in which Tampa Bay has had multiple players skate in an All-Star Game (2020: 2; 2019: 3; 2018: 4; 2017: 2; 2016: 2). The Lightning have three players on rosters for the 2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game.

**3** – The most player representatives from a single team for the 2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game, with the host Golden Knights (**Jonathan Marchessault, Alex Pietrangelo, Mark Stone**) and two-time defending champion Lightning (**Victor Hedman, Steven Stamkos, Andrei Vasilevskiy**) tied for the most.

**3** – Number of All-Star Game titles won by the Pacific Division in the five years under the 3-on-3 format, the most of any division (Metropolitan: 2; Atlantic & Central: 0).

# THE PLAYERS

## ATLANTIC DIVISION

*All-Star appearance in brackets (including 2022); stats through Feb. 2, 2022*

### F 37 Patrice Bergeron, BOS (3rd)

\* Bergeron ranks among the top five in the Bruins' 97-season history for [games played](#) (3rd), [points](#) (4th), [assists](#) (4th) and [goals](#) (5th).

\* Bergeron has been a finalist for the Frank J. Selke Trophy in each of the past 10 seasons, an NHL record for that category and tied with **Wayne Gretzky** (Hart Memorial Trophy: 1979-80–1988-89) for the most consecutive years as a top-three finalist for any voted NHL Award.

\* Bergeron has won the Selke Trophy four times, tied for the most in NHL history with **Bob Gainey**.

\* Bergeron, in his [18th NHL season](#) and second as Bruins captain, trails only **Brad Marchand** and **Andrew Cogliano** for the most [shorthanded goals among active players](#).

### F 11 Jonathan Huberdeau, FLA (2nd)

\* Huberdeau is Florida's franchise leader in [points](#) and [assists](#), and sits third on the club's all-time [goals](#) list. In March, he is expected to set a new benchmark for career [games played](#) in a Panthers uniform.

\* Huberdeau matched a franchise record with an eight-game [assist streak](#) earlier this season.

\* Huberdeau is on pace to record the first 100-point season in Panthers franchise history.

\* Only three players heading to the 2022 Honda NHL All Star have more overtime assists under the three-on-three format than Huberdeau (12): **Leon Draisaitl** (15), **Johnny Gaudreau** (14) and **Connor McDavid** (14).

### F 71 Dylan Larkin, DET (2nd)

\* Larkin has the most overtime goals (7) and points (16) among Red Wings players since the three-on-three format was introduced in 2015-16.

\* Larkin has the most multi-point games (70) among Red Wings players since 2015-16 when he entered the NHL.

\* Larkin, in his second season as Red Wings captain, trails only four players on the [franchise's all-time overtime goals](#) list: **Sergei Fedorov**, **Brendan Shanahan**, **Steve Yzerman** and **Pavel Datsyuk**.

\* Larkin had four overtime goals under the three-on-three format in 2018-19, the [most in a single season in Red Wings history](#). He shares the NHL lead with three [overtime goals](#) so far this season.

### F 34 Auston Matthews, TOR (4th)

\* Earlier this season, Matthews became the fastest U.S.-born player in NHL history to score 200 goals (338 GP).

\* One of three players in NHL history to record a road goal streak of 10+ games, following **Steve Yzerman** and **Pavel Bure**.

\* In 2020-21, Matthews became the first player in Maple Leafs history to capture the Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy, which first was awarded in 1998-99, as well as the first Toronto player in 75 years to top the NHL in goals (**Gaye Stewart**: 37 G in 50 GP in 1945-46).

\* Matthews is on pace to become the fourth different player in Maple Leafs franchise history – and first in nearly 30 years – to score [50 goals in a season](#).

\* Matthews is poised to join **Alex Ovechkin** as the second active player to record at least [six consecutive 30-goal seasons](#). Fellow 2022 NHL All-Star captain **Connor McDavid** also can join that list in 2021-22.

#### **F 91 Steven Stamkos, TBL (7th)**

\* Captain of the two-time defending Stanley Cup champion Lightning, Stamkos is the franchise leader in [goals](#) and also ranks among the top three in club history for [points](#) (2nd), [assists](#) (3rd) and [games played](#) (3rd). He is tied with **Martin St. Louis** for the most [overtime goals in franchise history](#) (10).

\* [In December](#), Stamkos became the 10th active NHL player to record 900 career points with one franchise.

\* A two-time Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy winner (2009-10, 2011-12), Stamkos is one of two active players who has scored at least [60 goals in a season](#) (also **Alex Ovechkin**).

\* Stamkos (7, including 2022) is poised to overtake **Martin St. Louis** (6) for the most NHL All-Star Game appearances by a Lightning player. The two players skated alongside one another with Team Lidstrom at the 2011 NHL All-Star Game in Raleigh – the first appearance for Stamkos and last for St. Louis.

\* Stamkos is set to become one of five active players to make seven career NHL All-Star Game appearances, joining following **Patrick Kane** (9), **Alex Ovechkin** (7), **Claude Giroux** (7, including 2022) and **Shea Weber** (7).

#### **F 14 Nick Suzuki, MTL (1st)**

\* At age 21, Suzuki led the Canadiens with 16 points during their run to the 2021 Stanley Cup Final. He has 11 career playoff goals, which are the second-most ever by a Canadiens player before age 22, behind only **Claude Lemieux** (14).

\* Suzuki recorded his 100th NHL point in December (154 GP), becoming the third-fastest Canadiens player in the past 25 years to reach the career benchmark, behind **Saku Koivu** (131 GP) and **Michael Ryder** (138 GP).

\* Suzuki (No. 13 in 2017) was one of a [trio of first-round selections](#) the Golden Knights made in the franchise’s first NHL Draft, along with **Cody Glass** (No. 6) and **Erik Brannstrom** (No. 15).

#### **F 7 Brady Tkachuk (2nd)**

\* In his first season as Senators captain, Tkachuk is the youngest ever to wear the “C” for the franchise.

\* This is Tkachuk’s second NHL All-Star Game after he played at the 2020 event in his hometown of St. Louis – where he joined his brother, Matthew, and father, Keith (a 5x NHL All-Star), on stage for the first-ever Gatorade NHL Shooting Stars.

\* The Tkachuks are set to join a group of notable father-son combos who each skated in multiple NHL All-Star Games; the likes of **Gordie** (23x) and **Mark Howe** (4x), **Bobby** (12x) and **Brett Hull** (8x) as well as **Bill** (2x) and **Kevin Dineen** (2x) are already on that list.

#### **D 26 Rasmus Dahlin, BUF (1st)**

\* Dahlin leads all Sabres skaters in [assists](#) this season and paces Buffalo blueliners in [goals](#) and [points](#).

\* Dahlin tallied 84 NHL points before his 20th birthday in 2020 (141 GP), which stands as the second-most career points as a teenager by a defenseman in NHL history, behind **Phil Housley** (132 PTS in 141 GP).

\* Dahlin, 21, is set to join **Phil Housley** (age 19 in 1984) and **Mike Ramsey** (age 21 in 1982) as the third Sabres defenseman to play in an NHL All-Star Game before his 22nd birthday.

\* Dahlin, 21, is set to join **Erik Karlsson** as the second Swedish-born defenseman to play in an NHL All-Star Game before age 22. Karlsson did so in 2011 at age 20 and in 2012 at age 21.

\* Dahlin is expected to become the first Sabres defenseman to play in an NHL All-Star Game since **Brian Campbell** in 2008.

#### **D 77 Victor Hedman, TBL (3rd)**

\* A member of the two-time defending Stanley Cup champion Lightning, Hedman is the franchise leader in [goals](#), [assists](#), [points](#) and [games played](#) among defensemen.

\* Hedman has seven overtime goals under the three-on-three format, the most among defensemen set to play in the 2022 Honda NHL All-Star Game.

\* Hedman has been a finalist for the [James Norris Memorial Trophy](#) in each of the past five seasons, winning in 2017-18 (a first in Lightning history). His trophy case also includes the 2019-20 Conn Smythe Trophy.

#### **G 36 Jack Campbell, TOR (1st)**

\* In 2020-21, Campbell established a Maple Leafs franchise record with an [11-game winning streak](#).

\* Campbell boasted a 17-5-2 record through his first 25 games of 2021-22. Only one goaltender has recorded more wins through their first 25 games of a season with the Maple Leafs: **George Hainsworth** (18 in 1934-35).

\* Campbell is poised to join **Frederik Andersen** (2020), **Curtis Joseph** (2000) and **Felix Potvin** (1994, 1996) as the only goaltenders in the last 45 years to represent the Maple Leafs in an NHL All-Star Game.

#### **G 88 Andrei Vasilevskiy, TBL (4th)**

\* A member of the two-time defending Stanley Cup champion Lightning, Vasilevskiy is the franchise leader in regular-season [wins](#), [shutouts](#) and [games played](#) among goaltenders.

\* Vasilevskiy has been a finalist for the [Vezina Trophy](#) in each of the past four seasons, winning in 2018-19 (a first in Lightning history). His trophy case also includes the 2020-21 Conn Smythe Trophy.

\* Vasilevskiy has the most wins (31) under the three-on-three overtime format among goaltenders.

\* In November, Vasilevskiy (318 GP) became the second-fastest goaltender in NHL history to reach the 200-win mark, behind **Ken Dryden** (309 GP).

## CENTRAL DIVISION

All-Star appearance in brackets (including 2022); stats through Feb. 2, 2022

### F 81 Kyle Connor, WPG (1st)

\* Connor has the most goals among Jets players [since 2017-18](#) (his first full NHL season) and ranks among the top six in the [entire NHL over that span](#).

\* Connor is in the midst of his fifth career 20-goal season, tied for the fourth-most in Jets/Thrashers franchise history behind **Ilya Kovalchuk** (8), **Blake Wheeler** (7) and **Mark Scheifele** (6).

\* Connor is on pace to set career highs in goals, assists and points. He is tracking toward becoming the second Jets player to record 40 goals in a season since the club relocated to Winnipeg in 2011-12 (**Patrik Laine**: 44 G in 2017-18) and the third to post 80 points (**Blake Wheeler** and **Mark Scheifele**: 2x each).

### F 12 Alex DeBrincat, CHI (1st)

\* DeBrincat has four career NHL hat tricks, which trails only six players for the most since 2017-18 when he entered the League: **Alex Ovechkin** (11), **David Pastrnak** (11), **Connor McDavid** (9), **Mika Zibanejad** (7), **Patrice Bergeron** (6) and **Patrik Laine** (5).

\* In less than five seasons, DeBrincat has already climbed into the top 30 for [career goals in a Chicago uniform](#) – a list that dates back to 1926. He has scored more [goals since his debut in 2017-18](#) than any other Blackhawks player in that span.

\* DeBrincat leads 2022 Central Division All-Stars with seven goals under the three-on-three overtime format.

### F 91 Nazem Kadri, COL (1st)

\* Kadri has been among the top five point-getters in the NHL every day since Jan. 4 as he pursues the first top-20 finish of his career.

\* Kadri is on pace for his third career 30-goal season and first 100-point campaign. The last [100-point season by an Avalanche player](#) came in 2006-07 when **Joe Sakic** tallied 100 points in 82 games. He has already established a single-season career high for assists and needs only two points to equal a career-best set five years ago (2016-17: 61 points in 82 GP).

\* Kadri recorded his 50th point in his 34th game of 2021-22 to become the fourth different *Avalanche* player to hit the mark in less than 35 games, following **Peter Forsberg** (29 GP in 1995-96), **Mikko Rantanen** (31 GP in 2018-19) and **Nathan MacKinnon** (32 GP in 2019-20, 33 GP in 2018-19).

\* Kadri recorded at least one point in a career-best 13 consecutive appearances from Nov. 27, 2021 to Jan. 11, 2022 (6-17—23).

### F 97 Kirill Kaprizov, MIN (1st)

\* Kaprizov [won the Calder Memorial Trophy](#) last season after leading NHL rookies in [goals](#) (27) and [points](#) (51) – franchise records for Wild rookies in each category despite the abbreviated campaign.

\* Kaprizov recorded his 50th point of 2021-22 in his 38th game to become the fastest player in Wild franchise history to hit the mark in a season.

\* Kaprizov leads the Wild in [goals](#), [assists](#) and [points](#) since the start of last season.

\* Kaprizov has 3-2—5 under the three-on-three overtime format, including a goal in his first career game. [At the time](#), he was the third player in NHL history to net an overtime goal in his League debut.

\* Kaprizov recorded his 100th NHL point in his 92nd career game on Jan. 24, 2022, equaling **Connor McDavid** (92 GP) as the fourth-fastest active player to reach the benchmark behind **Alex Ovechkin** (77 GP), **Sidney Crosby** (80 GP) and **Evgeni Malkin** (89 GP). He was the fastest player in Wild history to hit the mark.

#### **F 9 Clayton Keller, ARI (2nd)**

\* Keller (Chesterfield, Mo.) is one of two Missouri-born players to skate in an NHL All-Star Game, after five-time All-Star forward **Pat LaFontaine** (St. Louis, Mo.).

\* Keller (also 2019) can become the fourth Coyotes forward to play in multiple NHL All-Star events since the club relocated to Arizona in 1996-97, following **Keith Tkachuk** (3x), **Shane Doan** (2x) and **Jeremy Roenick** (2x).

\* Keller leads all Coyotes in [goals](#), [assists](#) and [points](#) since the start of 2016-17, his first season in the NHL.

\* Keller was a [Calder Memorial Trophy](#) finalist in 2017-18 after finishing [second in rookie scoring](#) with 65 points. He is the only Coyotes player to be a top-three finalist for the award (since relocation in 1996-97).

#### **F 25 Jordan Kyrou, STL (1st)**

\* Kyrou has already established career highs in goals, assists and points this season, besting previous marks set in 2020-21. He leads the Blues in [goals](#) and [points](#) ahead of his first NHL All-Star Game.

\* Kyrou became the [first player in NHL history](#) to record four or more points in an outdoor game when he tallied 2-2—4 against the Wild in the 2022 Discover NHL Winter Classic at Target Field on New Year's Day. Each of his points came in the second period, [also an outdoor record](#).

\* Kyrou, 23, is set to join **Vladimir Tarasenko** (age 23 in 2015) as the second Blues player in the last 35 years to skate in an NHL All-Star Game at age 23 or younger.

#### **F 16 Joe Pavelski, DAL (4th)**

\* Pavelski (37 years, 209 days on Feb. 5, 2022) is set to become the oldest player to skate in an NHL All-Star Game since **Jaromir Jagr** in 2016 (43 years, 350 days).

\* Pavelski (Plover, Wis.) is set to tie **Gary Suter** (1986, 1988, 1989 & 1991) for the most All-Star Game appearances by a Wisconsin-born player (4). The only other players born in the state to skate in an NHL All-Star Game are **Phil Kessel** (3x), **Ryan Suter** (3x) and **Mark Johnson** (1x).

\* Pavelski is [one of eight active players](#) to record 400 career goals and is among the [top 10](#) in NHL history for goals among U.S.-born players.

\* Pavelski is on the verge of his 12th career 20-goal season, a feat achieved by only eight other active players: **Alex Ovechkin**, **Patrick Kane**, **Sidney Crosby**, **Steven Stamkos**, **Jonathan Toews**, **Phil Kessel**, **Evgeni Malkin** and **Patrice Bergeron**.

\* Aided by a [five-point showing](#) Jan. 12, 37-year-old Pavelski is on track to become the oldest player in the last nine seasons to hit 50 points in less than 50 games played. In 2012-13, **Martin St. Louis** hit 50 points in his 40th game at age 37.

#### **D 59 Roman Josi (4th)**

\* Josi is set to make his fourth NHL All-Star Game appearance (also 2016, 2019, 2020), which will place him ahead of **Pekka Rinne** (3x) and behind only **Shea Weber** (5x) for the most ever by a Predators player.

\* Winner of the 2019-20 James Norris Memorial Trophy, Josi has the [most assists](#) by a player in Predators franchise history and ranks [second in points](#). He also is the club leader in [points by a defenseman](#) and ranks second in [goals among blueliners](#).

\* Josi (Bern, Switzerland) is within striking distance of becoming the first Swiss-born player in NHL history to reach the 500-point milestone.

\* Josi's addition to the Central Division roster is set to make 2022 the second straight NHL All-Star Game to feature multiple Swiss-born players, with Josi (Bern, Switzerland) joining **Timo Meier** (Herisau, Switzerland) this year after he and **Nico Hischier** (Brig, Switzerland) each skated at the 2020 event in St. Louis.

#### **D 8 Cale Makar, COL (1st)**

\* Makar [leads NHL defensemen](#) in goals this season after joining **Bobby Orr** (2x) as the second different blueliner in the League's modern era (since 1943-44) to score at least [16 goals within the first 30 games of a season](#).

\* Makar posted a five-game goal streak from Nov. 17-26, 2021, a [franchise record for a defenseman](#).

\* Earlier this season, Makar became the fastest active defenseman to reach 100 career points. He hit the mark in his 108th game, tied for the [sixth-fewest by a defenseman in NHL history](#).

\* On Jan. 30, 2022, Makar (140 GP) became the fastest active defenseman to reach 100 career assists and the fourth-fastest blueliner in NHL history to hit the mark behind **Sergei Zubov** (127 GP), **Mark Howe** (135 GP) and **Stefan Persson** (135 GP).

\* Makar is set to become the first Avalanche defenseman to skate in an NHL All-Star Game since 2004 when **Rob Blake** suited up for the Western Conference in Minnesota.

#### **G 26 Juuse Saros, NSH (1st)**

\* Saros is among the top three in the NHL for [wins in 2021-22](#), posting a career-high 24 victories to date.

\* Saros recorded his 100th NHL win in his final outing before the All-Star Game, becoming the third goaltender to accumulate as many [victories with Nashville](#) after **Pekka Rinne** (369) and **Tomas Vokoun** (161). Rinne (2016, 2018, 2019) and Vokoun (2004) also represented the Predators at the NHL All-Star Game.

\* Saros leads the NHL with a [.923 save percentage](#) since the start of the 2019-20 season (min. 100 GP).

#### **G 33 Cam Talbot, MIN (1st)**

\* Talbot, 34, is set to become the sixth goaltender in League history to appear in the NHL All-Star Game for the first time at age 34 or older. He would join **Johnny Bower** (age 36 in 1961), **Manny Legace** (age 34 in 2008), **Mike Smith** (age 34 in 2017), **Dwayne Roloson** (age 34 in 2004) and **Rejean Lemelin** (age 34 in 1989).

\* Talbot is set to become the fourth goaltender to represent the Wild in an NHL All-Star Game, following **Devan Dubnyk** (2016, 2017, 2019), **Niklas Backstrom** (2009) and **Dwayne Roloson** (2004).

\* Talbot recorded his 30th win in a Wild uniform on Nov. 26, 2021, while appearing in his 49th game with the club – the second-fastest to reach the benchmark in club history behind **Devan Dubnyk** (42 GP).

## METROPOLITAN DIVISION

*All-Star appearance in brackets (including 2022); stats through Feb. 2, 2022*

### F 20 Sebastian Aho, CAR (2nd)

\* Aho recorded the 200th assist of his NHL career in his 400th game, the fastest in Carolina team history and second-fastest in Hurricanes/Whalers franchise history to reach the benchmark behind **Ron Francis** (263 GP).

\* Aho is on the verge of becoming the first Carolina player to begin his NHL career with six consecutive 20-goal seasons. Overall, Aho is set to become the third player in franchise history to achieve the feat, following **Ron Francis** (10) and **Kevin Dineen** (6) who each did so with the Whalers.

\* Aho recently became the Hurricanes/Whalers franchise leader in [career overtime goals](#).

\* Aho had [multiple points in six consecutive games played](#) from Dec. 2-30, 2021 – a first by a Hurricanes player. The only other players to achieve the feat this season are fellow All-Star and Oilers forward **Connor McDavid**, as well as Wild forward **Mats Zuccarello**.

### F 28 Claude Giroux, PHI (7th)

\* Giroux is set to make his seventh All-Star Game appearance, second-most in Flyers history (**Bobby Clarke**: 8).

\* Giroux is set to become one of five active players to make seven career NHL All-Star Game appearances, joining following **Patrick Kane** (9), **Alex Ovechkin** (7), **Steven Stamkos** (7, including 2022) and **Shea Weber** (7).

\* Giroux leads all players with the most regular-season overtime games played (135) since the three-on-three format was introduced in 2015-16.

\* Earlier this season, Giroux surpassed **Bill Barber** into second place on the [Flyers all-time points list](#) and overtook **Bobby Clarke** for the franchise lead in [power-play points](#). Giroux also ranks among the top 10 in franchise history for career [assists](#) (2nd), [games played](#) (2nd) and [goals](#) (9th). Giroux and Clarke are tied for the most [seasons played](#) in franchise history.

### F 59 Jake Guentzel, PIT (1st)

\* After being selected to the All-Star Game in 2020, Guentzel (Omaha, Neb.) missed the event due to injury but now can become the first Nebraska-born player to skate in an NHL All-Star Game.

\* Guentzel is in the midst of his fifth consecutive 20-goal season. Only six players have more such campaigns since 2016-17 when Guentzel entered the League: **Alex Ovechkin**, **Brad Marchand**, **Leon Draisaitl**, **David Pastrnak**, **Connor McDavid** and **Auston Matthews** all have six in that span.

\* Guentzel began 2021-22 with a point in each of his first 15 road appearances, the fifth different player in NHL history to achieve such a feat after **Wayne Gretzky** (3x), **Mario Lemieux**, **Paul Coffey** and **Bernie Nicholls**.

### F 86 Jack Hughes, NJD (1st)

\* Hughes (20 years, 267 days) can become the fourth player in Devils franchise history to appear in an All-Star Game before age 21; he would join **Kirk Muller** (19 years, 4 days in 1985; 19 years, 361 days in 1986), **Scott Gomez** (20 years, 45 days in 2000) and **Joe Cirella** (20 years, 267 days in 1984).

\* Hughes (Orlando, Fla.) can join his brother, **Quinn Hughes** (2020), as the only Florida-born players to skate in an NHL All-Star Game.

\* Hughes owns the most three-point games (6) by any Devils player since 2019-20 when he entered the NHL.

\* Hughes leads the Devils in three-on-three overtime goals (3; tied) and points (5) since his debut in 2019-20.

### F 20 Chris Kreider, NYR (2nd)

\* Kreider was the first player to reach 30 goals in 2021-22, hitting the benchmark for the [first time in his 10 NHL seasons](#). It was the first time in the League's modern era (since 1943-44) that a Rangers player was the first in the NHL to hit the 30-goal mark in a season.

\* Kreider (43 GP) became the fastest Rangers player in the last 45 years to hit the 30-goal mark in a season and just the third New York player in the League's modern era (since 1943-44) to do so within his first 43 games of a season, following **Rod Gilbert** (42 GP in 1971-72) and **Don Murdoch** (43 GP in 1976-77).

\* Kreider is on pace to become the [fourth player in Rangers history](#) to score 50+ goals in a season and first since **Jaromir Jagr** set a franchise record with 54 in 2006-07.

### F 92 Evgeny Kuznetsov, WSH (2nd)

\* Kuznetsov has recorded three seasons with 50 or more assists since making his debut in 2013-14. The only players with more such campaigns in Capitals history are **Nicklas Backstrom** (9), **Adam Oates** (4), **Michal Pivonka** (4) and **Alex Ovechkin** (4).

\* During the 2018 Stanley Cup Playoffs, Kuznetsov led all players with 12-20—32 in 24 games. That total included a series-high 1-7—8 in five games against the Golden Knights in the Stanley Cup Final – with the last of those points coming in Washington's Cup-clinching Game 5 victory at T-Mobile Arena.

\* Kuznetsov has 17 points in overtime since the three-on-three format was introduced in 2015-16, tied for the most among 2022 Metropolitan Division All-Stars behind **Claude Giroux** (17).

### F 43 Tom Wilson, WSH (1st)

\* A top-20 pick in the 2012 NHL Draft, Wilson has played each of his nine NHL seasons with the Capitals and was part of their Stanley Cup victory in Las Vegas four years ago.

\* Wilson eclipsed the 100-career goal milestone earlier this season and is on pace for career highs in goals, assists and points.

### D 3 Adam Pelech, NYI (1st)

\* Pelech is set to become the first Islanders defenseman in more than a decade to play in an NHL All-Star Game and the eighth blueliner overall to represent the club, following **Denis Potvin** (9x; last: 1988), **Dave Langevin** (1983), **Mathieu Schneider** (1996), **Scott Lachance** (1997), **Roman Hamrlik** (2003), **Adrian Aucoin** (2004) and **Mark Streit** (2009).

\* Selected in the third round (65th overall) by New York in the 2012 NHL Draft, Pelech can join **Denis Potvin**, **Scott Lachance** and **Dave Langevin** as the fourth Islanders defenseman to be drafted by the team and represent them in an All-Star Game.

\* Pelech played four seasons with the Erie Otters of the OHL where he was a teammate of fellow NHL All-Star **Connor McDavid**.

### D 8 Zach Werenski, CBJ (2nd)

\* Werenski is one of seven defensemen with at least 70 [goals since 2016-17](#) when he entered the NHL.

\* Werenski holds the Blue Jackets franchise record for [goals by a defenseman](#) and sits among the top three in [points](#) (2nd) and [assists](#) (3rd) among blueliners. He also ranks among the top 10 in franchise history for [points](#) (9th) and [assists](#) (9th) by a player at any position.

\* In 2019-20, Werenski set a franchise record for goals in a [single season by a defenseman](#) (20). He is one of seven active defensemen to record [20 or more goals in a season](#).

### **G 31 Frederik Andersen, CAR (2nd)**

\* Andersen started 2021-22 with eight straight victories, one shy of the [longest winning streak](#) by a goaltender at any point in a season in Hurricanes/Whalers history.

\* Andersen is set to become the third goaltender in the League's expansion era (since 1967-68) to appear in consecutive All-Star games while representing different clubs in each year, following **Dominik Hasek** (2001 w/ BUF, 2002 w/ DET) and **Mike Smith** (2017 w/ ARI, 2018 w/ CGY).

\* Andersen (Herning, Denmark) is one of two Danish-born players to skate in the event – forward **Frans Nielsen**, who also hails from Herning, represented the Red Wings in 2017.

\* His trophy case includes the [William M. Jennings Trophy](#), which he earned in 2015-16 alongside fellow 2022 NHL All-Star and former Ducks teammate **John Gibson**.

### **G 35 Tristan Jarry, PIT (2nd)**

\* Jarry owns the [Penguins record for longest shutout sequence](#) at 177:15, established in 2019-20.

\* Jarry ranks [second in wins since the start of last season](#) and is within striking distance of moving into the top five in [franchise history for wins](#) by a goaltender.

\* Jarry (also 2020) is one of three goaltenders to represent the Penguins in the NHL All-Star Game (also **Marc-Andre Fleury**: 2015, 2011; **Michel Dion**: 1982).

## **PACIFIC DIVISION**

*All-Star appearance in brackets (including 2022); stats through Feb. 2, 2022*

### **F 29 Leon Draisaitl, EDM (3rd)**

\* Draisaitl (Cologne, Germany) is the only *German national* to make multiple NHL All-Star Game appearances (also 2019, 2020). He is one of six *German-born* players to skate in the event, following **Walt Tkaczuk** (1970), **Willie Huber** (1983), **Uwe Krupp** (1991), **Marco Sturm** (1999) and **Dany Heatley** (2003, 2007, 2009).

\* Draisaitl has more career goals, assists and points than any *German born-and-trained* player in NHL history.

\* Draisaitl is tracking toward career highs in goals and points as he seeks a third [career 100-point season](#) (2018-19 and 2019-20) – a feat achieved by only five active players: **Sidney Crosby** (6), **Connor McDavid** (4), **Alex Ovechkin** (4), **Evgeni Malkin** (3) and **Joe Thornton** (3).

\* Already a winner of the Hart Memorial Trophy, Art Ross Trophy and Ted Lindsay Award (all in 2019-20), Draisaitl is among the NHL leaders in both goals and points so far in 2021-22. On pace for the highest goal total by an Oilers player since **Wayne Gretzky** (62 G) in 1986-87, Draisaitl can become the first Edmonton player to claim the [Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy](#) since its inception in 1998-99.

### **F 7 Jordan Eberle, SEA (2nd)**

\* Eberle made his NHL All-Star Game debut a decade ago, notching an assist for Team Chara in a 12-9 victory at the 2012 event in Ottawa. Representing the Oilers at age 21, Eberle was amid the best statistical season of his career to date – he finished 2011-12 with 34-42—76, all personal bests.

\* Eberle scored the [first hat trick](#) in Kraken history on Nov. 4, 2021, against the Sabres.

\* Eberle is on pace for his seventh career 20-goal season and first since 2017-18, his first campaign with the Islanders.

### **F 13 Johnny Gaudreau, CGY (6th)**

\* Gaudreau (Salem, N.J.) and **Bobby Ryan** (Cherry Hill, N.J.) are the only players born in New Jersey to skate in an NHL All-Star Game.

\* Gaudreau has 5-6—11 under the 3-on-3 All-Star Game format (7 GP) which trails only **Connor McDavid** (2-11—13 in 7 GP) and **Sidney Crosby** (6-6—12 in 5 GP) for the most points since its inception in 2016.

\* In his ninth season with the Flames, Gaudreau ranks among the top 10 in franchise history for [assists](#) (6th) and [points](#) (7th) and is less than 10 goals away from doing so on the [goals list](#).

\* Gaudreau has recorded 40 or more assists in a season six times and is on pace to do so again in 2021-22. He also is tracking toward the first 100-point season by a Flames player since **Theo Fleury** in 1992-93.

### **F 9 Adrian Kempe, LAK (1st)**

\* Kempe leads the Kings in [goals](#) and [game-winning goals](#) in 2021-22, career highs in each category with nearly half a season to play.

\* Kempe had a career-high six-game point streak from Oct. 31 – Nov. 11 (4-3—7 in 6 GP), the second-longest by a Kings player this season behind **Alex Iafallo** (7 GP).

\* Kempe (Kramfors, Sweden) won the Calder Cup with the Kings' AHL affiliate in 2014-15 and claimed a gold medal at the 2018 World Championships.

#### **F 81 Jonathan Marchessault, VGK (1st)**

\* Representing the host Golden Knights, Marchessault has the most career goals, assists, points and games played in the club's five-season history.

\* Marchessault hit the 20-goal mark in his final game before the break, reaching the plateau for the fifth time in his career and fourth since joining Vegas (the most in club history).

#### **F 97 Connor McDavid, EDM (5th)**

\* McDavid has four 100-point seasons – and is on pace for a fifth – which is a number surpassed by only one active player: **Sidney Crosby** (6).

\* McDavid reached 600 career points faster than any active skater (421 GP) and required the [sixth-fewest games in NHL history](#) to hit the milestone.

\* McDavid's trophy case includes three Art Ross Trophies, three Ted Lindsay Awards and a pair of Hart Trophy wins

\* McDavid posted a [17-game point streak](#) from Oct. 13 – Nov. 20, 2021, which is the longest by any player this season and the longest by an Oilers skater since **Wayne Gretzky** had a 19-game run in 1986-87.

\* McDavid is poised to extend his streak of [consecutive 30-goal seasons](#) to six in 2021-22; **Alex Ovechkin** is the only active player to post a run of at least that length, while fellow 2022 NHL All-Star captain **Auston Matthews** also is in position to extend his streak to six seasons.

#### **F 28 Timo Meier, SJS (1st)**

\* Meier set a Sharks franchise record with goals in a game, doing so against the Kings on Martin Luther King Jr. Day. It was the fifth [five-goal game by an NHL player](#) over the past 25 years and the first time in more than 27 years that a player scored five goals *within the first two periods* of a game.

\* Meier notched his 20th goal in his 35th game of 2021-22, the second-fastest Sharks player to hit the mark over the past 12 seasons behind fellow 2022 NHL All-Star and former team captain **Joe Pavelski** (32 GP in 2018-19).

\* Meier (Herisau, Switzerland) is one of four Swiss-born players to reach 100 career goals, alongside **Nino Niederreiter** (Chur, Switzerland), **Roman Josi** (Bern, Switzerland) and **Kevin Fiala** (St. Gallen, Switzerland).

\* Meier (Herisau, Switzerland) can become the fifth Swiss-born player to skate in an NHL All-Star Game, after **Mark Streit** (Bern, Switzerland; 2009), **Jonas Hiller** (Felben Wellhausen, Switzerland; 2011) and **Roman Josi** (Bern, Switzerland; 2016, 2019, 2020, 2022) and **Nico Hischier** (Brig, Switzerland; 2020).

#### **F 61 Mark Stone, VGK (1st)**

\* Stone is in his second season as Golden Knights captain – the only player to wear the “C” for the club.

\* Stone had a nine-game assist streak from Nov 24 – Dec. 14, 2021 (4-11—15 in 9 GP), the [longest ever by a Vegas player](#) and tied for the longest assist streak by any player in 2021-22

\* A two-time [Frank J. Selke Trophy](#) finalist, Stone posted 20 goals and 60 points in each of his first two full seasons with Vegas and has led the NHL in takeaways in two of the previous three seasons.

## F 19 Troy Terry, ANA (1st)

\* Terry (Denver, Colo.) can become the third Colorado-born player to skate in an NHL All-Star Game, after fellow Denverites **Ben Bishop** (2016) and **Jacob Slavin** (2020).

\* Terry leads the Ducks in [goals](#), [points](#) and [game-winning goals](#) so far in 2021-22, setting career highs in every major offensive category.

\* Terry is on pace to become the fourth different player in Ducks history to score [40+ goals in a season](#) – a feat only **Teemu Selanne** (5x), **Paul Kariya** (3x) and **Corey Perry** (2x) have achieved.

\* Terry posted a [16-game point streak](#) from Oct. 18 – Nov. 18, 2021, the second-longest by any player this season behind Pacific Division captain **Connor McDavid** (17 GP).

## D 7 Alex Pietrangelo, VGK (3rd)

\* Pietrangelo is on pace to become the [13th active defenseman](#) to record 500 career points, sitting one point back of the mark with 122-377—499 in 842 NHL games.

\* Pietrangelo is averaging more than 25:00 of ice time per game this season, [tops among Golden Knights skaters](#) and among the [top 10 in the NHL](#) this season.

\* Pietrangelo set a Golden Knights benchmark with a [nine-game road point](#) streak from Nov. 4 – Dec. 16, 2021.

\* Captain of the 2019 Stanley Cup champion Blues before joining Vegas in 2020-21, Pietrangelo was his team's highest-scoring defenseman in nine of his 11 full NHL seasons entering 2021-22.

## G 35 Thatcher Demko, VAN (1st)

\* Demko (San Diego, Calif.) can become the first California-born goaltender to appear in an NHL All-Star Game. To date, the only California-born player of any position to skate in an NHL All-Star Game is **Auston Matthews** (San Ramon, Calif.).

\* Demko posted a career-high seven-game win streak from Dec. 6, 2021 – Jan. 1, 2022, two shy of the [franchise record](#) and the longest by a Canucks goaltender since 2014-15 when **Ryan Miller** had a run of equal length.

\* Demko has reached both the 50-win and 100-games played milestones in 2021-22, one of eight netminders to [reach each mark](#) with the Canucks.

\* Demko shares the NHL lead with a [.937 save percentage at even strength](#) this season (min. 20 GP).

## G 36 John Gibson, ANA (3rd)

\* Gibson has played his entire nine-season career with the Ducks where he ranks among the top three in franchise history for [wins](#) (3rd), [shutouts](#) (3rd) and [games played](#) (3rd) among goaltenders.

\* Posted a career-high seven-game winning streak from Oct. 31 – Nov. 16, 2021, the [longest by a Ducks netminder](#) since 2015-16 when fellow 2022 NHL All-Star and former teammate **Frederik Andersen** had a seven-game run for Anaheim.

\* His trophy case includes the [William M. Jennings Trophy](#), which he earned in 2015-16 alongside fellow 2022 NHL All-Star and former Ducks teammate **Frederik Andersen**.

\* Gibson (Pittsburgh, Pa.), who has made [40+ saves in a regular-season game](#) more than 20 times in his career, is one of [six active U.S.-born goaltenders](#) with 150+ career NHL wins.

## **Andrew Brunette, FLA (1st; Atlantic)**

- \* Florida led the Atlantic Division with a .729 points percentage when Brunette was [named to the All-Star Game](#).
- \* The Panthers (32-10-5, 69 points) have their best record through 47 games of a season in franchise history and currently rank third in the NHL with a .734 points-percentage.
- \* The Panthers lead the NHL in [goals scored in regulation/overtime](#).
- \* Florida owns a [25-10-5 record \(.688\) since Brunette took over as head coach Oct. 29, 2021](#).
- \* Brunette is set to become the third Florida head coach to serve in that role at an All-Star Game, following **Gerard Gallant** (2016) and **Doug MacLean** (1996 & 1997).

## **Jared Bednar, COL (1st; Central)**

- \* Colorado led the Central Division with a .719 points percentage when Bednar was [named to the All-Star Game](#).
- \* The Avalanche (32-8-4, 68 points) have their best record through 44 games of a season in franchise history and currently lead the NHL with a .773 points-percentage.
- \* The Avalanche have occupied first place in both the Western Conference and Central Division every day since Jan. 15 when they earned their 24th win of the season.
- \* The Avalanche rank second in the NHL in [goals scored in regulation/overtime](#).
- \* Bednar is set to become the first Colorado/Quebec head coach to serve in that role at an All-Star Game.

## **Rod Brind'Amour, CAR (1st; Metropolitan)**

- \* Carolina led the Metropolitan Division and the NHL with a .758 points percentage when Brind'Amour was [named to the All-Star Game](#).
- \* The Hurricanes (31-9-2, 64 points) have their best record through 42 games of a season in franchise history and currently rank second in the NHL with a .762 points-percentage.
- \* The Hurricanes have allowed a League-low 98 [goals against in regulation/overtime](#) and rank among the top 10 in the NHL in [goals scored](#).
- \* Brind'Amour can become the first Carolina/Hartford head coach to serve in that role at an All-Star Game.
- \* Brind'Amour played for the Wales Conference in the 1992 NHL All-Star Game, representing the hometown Flyers in a 10-6 loss to the Campbell Conference at the Spectrum.

## Hockey History in Las Vegas

\* Las Vegas will become the [31st different city](#) to host at least one NHL All-Star Game, while Nevada will become the 19th different U.S. state to welcome the event.

\* Las Vegas hosted one International Hockey League All-Star Game in 1994-95, which celebrated the 50-year anniversary of the now-defunct minor professional circuit. In that showcase, [Hubie McDonough](#) of the San Diego Gulls scored a hat trick and a shootout goal to lead the Western Conference to a 13-12 win over the Eastern Conference at the Thomas & Mack Center. McDonough had previously shared NHL ice with the likes of **Wayne Gretzky**, **Pat LaFontaine** and **Doug Wilson** across 195 NHL games over five seasons (1988-89 to 1992-93) with the Kings, Islanders and Sharks.

\* The host Las Vegas Thunder were represented in the 1995 IHL All-Star Game by defensemen **Todd Richards** and **Jeff Sharples** along with goaltender **Eldon “Pokey” Reddick**. **Ken Hitchcock** (Kalamazoo Wings) and **Butch Goring** (Denver Grizzlies) were opposing coaches in the event, which also featured **Scott Arniel** (Houston Aeros), **Gino Cavallini** (Milwaukee Admirals), **Dallas Eakins** (Cincinnati Cyclones), **Manny Fernandez** (Kalamazoo Wings) and **Ian Laperriere** (Peoria Rivermen).

\* Did You Know? **Radek Bonk** claimed IHL Rookie of the Year honors in 1993-94 while playing for the Las Vegas Thunder. He went on to collect 194-303—497 in 969 NHL games with the Senators, Canadiens and Predators.



\* **Radek Bonk** also played for the Thunder in 1994-95 when one of his teammates was **Manon Rhéaume**, who two years earlier became the [first woman ever to play in an NHL game](#). Rhéaume played two games with the Thunder, including a start Nov. 8, 1994 against the Houston Aeros in front of 10,491 fans at the Thomas & Mack Center – the largest weeknight crowd in the Thunder’s two-year history, as reported in the recap by the North County Times. Her debut with the club was Oct. 29, 1994, when she stopped all five shots against in 12:47 of relief for **Eldon “Pokey” Reddick** against the San Diego Gulls.



\* The last player to be named MVP of an NHL All-Star Game played in front of his NHL home crowd was **Ryan Johansen** of the Blue Jackets at Nationwide Arena in Columbus in 2015, a feat achieved nine times overall.
