
### NHL MORNING SKATE - OCT. 23, 2022



\* Stars forward **Joe Pavelski** posted 3-1—4 to eclipse **Brett Hull** as the oldest player in franchise history with a hat trick and help Dallas extend its season-opening point streak.

\* Sabres defenseman **Rasmus Dahlin** found the back of the net once again to extend the <u>longest</u> <u>season-opening goal streak by a blueliner in NHL history</u>.

\* **David Poile** of the Predators served his 3,000th career regular-season game as an NHL general manager and became the first GM in League history to reach the milestone.



<u>38-YEAR-OLD PAVELSKI TALLIES THREE TIMES AS STARS, DeBOER IMPROVE TO 4-0-1</u> Dallas forward **Joe Pavelski** (38 years, 103 days) became the <u>oldest player in Stars/North Stars</u>



<u>franchise history to score a hat trick</u> and the oldest NHL player on any team with a three-goal game since his former Sharks teammate **Joe Thornton** (39 years, 231 days on <u>Feb. 18, 2019</u>). Pavelski assisted on two of Thornton's three goals that night.

\* Dallas (4-0-1, 9 points) earned at least one point during each of its first five games in a season for the <u>sixth time in franchise history</u>, following 1996-97 (6-0-0), 1989-90 (5-0-1), 1982-83 (5-0-1), 2009-10 (2-0-3) and 2006-07 (5-0-0). **Peter DeBoer** became the second Stars/North Stars head coach to record a five-game point streak from the start of his tenure with the club, joining **Marc Crawford** (2-0-3 in 2009-10).

# DAHLIN, BLUES AND PENGUINS ALSO EXTEND SEASON-OPENING STREAKS

Sabres defenseman **Rasmus Dahlin** (1-1—2) scored a goal for the fifth time in as many games as Buffalo swept its Western Canada road trip, while St. Louis and Pittsburgh also extended noteworthy season-opening streaks:

\* Dahlin (5-3—8 in 5 GP) matched the <u>franchise record for longest season-opening goal streak</u> and **Alex Tuch** (6-1—7 in 5 GP) scored his team-leading sixth tally of the season as Buffalo improved to 4-1-0 (8 points). Dahlin established a new <u>franchise record for longest goal streak by a defenseman</u> *at any point* in a campaign and became the <u>first Sabres skater with a five-game run</u> since forward **Thomas Vanek** over 14 years ago (5 GP from Oct. 10-18, 2008).

\* **Jordan Binnington** turned aside all 23 shots he faced to record the <u>11th shutout of his NHL career</u> and help the Blues (3-0-0, 6 points) extend their <u>season-opening winning streak to three games</u>. St. Louis never trailed during each of its first three contests in a campaign for the second time in franchise history, following a <u>four-game run to open 2013-14</u>. The longest such streak by an NHL team is seven games, achieved by the <u>1969-70 Bruins</u> (who went on to meet the Blues in the <u>Stanley Cup Final that year</u>).




\* **Sidney Crosby** (1-2—3) scored the 79th game-winning goal of his NHL career to move into sole possession of first place on the <u>franchise's all-time list</u> and help Pittsburgh (4-0-1, 9 points) record a five-game season-opening point streak for the <u>second time in as many years</u>. Crosby also recorded his 162nd career three-point game with the Penguins, who have scored <u>26 goals this season</u> (5.2 G/GP).



## **RED WINGS, DUCKS SET TO SQUARE OFF ON ESPN**

The Red Wings (2-0-2, 6 points) and Ducks (1-3-1, 3 points) are set to clash on ESPN as part of the NHL's five-game slate Sunday. Detroit enters the contest with the opportunity to extend its seasonopening point streak to five games for the <u>eighth time in franchise history</u> and just the fourth in the NHL's expansion era (since 1967-68). The Red Wings' other runs over that span were in 1997-98 (5-0-1), 1972-73 (6-0-0) and 2011-12 (5-0-0).
